Program Description:

Emergency response, fire prevention and public fire safety education and training.

Operations for the Kenora Police Services (KPS) for crime prevention, law enforcement, assistance to victims of crime, public order maintenance and emergency response, including the Anti-Violence Intervention Strategy (A.V.I.S.). The KPS was disbanded on July 17, 2009, although ongoing costs related to WSIB and retiree benefits continue to accrue to the City.

Board overseeing police related operations in the City.

Policing services for the City of Kenora. Up until July 17, 2009, these services were provided to the former Towns of Keewatin and Jaffray Melick. Effective July 17, 2009, the OPP took over policing services for the entire City of Kenora.

Provision of by-law enforcement within City limits, and in particular the enforcement of the Animal Control By-law.

Rental revenues and costs related to various rental properties owned by the City.

Examination of plans, issuing building permits, inspection of construction and plumbing within City limits. Enforcement of building and property standards, by-laws and the Ontario Building Code. Maintenance of Municipal Street Addressing, issuance of outstanding work order certificates and responsible for facility management for City buildings.

Provision of emergency measures, including updating the plan and co-ordination of emergency activities and exercises.

Health & Safety Committee	271 – Health & Safety Comm.	Implementation and training requirements associated with the Occupational Health & Safety Act as coordinated through the City's Health & Safety Officer.
Provincial Offences	281 – Provincial Offences	Kenora's share of the net revenues associated with the Administration of Provincial Offences. Provincial Offences revenues refer to the fines paid by individuals as penalty for law infractions. The City runs this program under a separate fund. Net revenues generated from this program are shared between our municipal partners – Red Lake, Ear Falls and Sioux Narrows Nestor Falls.
