By-Law Number 92 - 2012

A By-law to Amend By-Law Number 150-2010 being a By-Law to Regulate the Keeping of Animals in the City of Kenora

Whereas the Council of the City of Kenora adopted by-law Number 150-2010 on the 9th day of August, 2010; and

Whereas it is deemed necessary and expedient to amend the by-law in order to provide an exemption from picking up dog waste for those with impairment requiring the use of a guide dog;

Now Therefore Be It Resolved That the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kenora hereby enacts as follows;-

- 1. That Section 1. "Definitions" of By-Law Number 150-2010 for the Corporation of the City of Kenora be and it is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 1.10 "Guide Dog"

Any dog specifically trained for and actually used by any person whose sight is impaired or is blind, or whose hearing is impaired or who is deaf, or who, that because of a handicap (within the meaning of the Human Rights Code) relies upon a dog as a guide.

To be numbered 1.10 and all definitions to follow renumbered accordingly.

- 2. That Section 4. "Dogs at Large" of By-Law Number 150-2010 for the Corporation of the City of Kenora be and is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 4.14 "Controlling Dog Waste within the City"
 - (a) The owner of a dog shall remove forthwith and dispose of any excrement left by the dog on any property other than the owner's property.

- 3. That Section 4. "Dogs at Large" of By-Law Number 150-2010 for the Corporation of the City of Kenora be and is hereby amended by adding thereto:
 - (b) That subsection 4.14 (a) shall not apply to a person with a disability who is reliant on a guide dog.
- 4. That this by-law shall take effect and come into force upon third and final reading thereof.
