By-Law Number 101- 2022

A By-Law to Adopt Amended Estimates for Capital Reserves to be incorporated into the Sums Required for Municipal Purposes during the Year 2022

Whereas Council of the City of Kenora adopted the 2022 Municipal Five Year Capital Plan by passing By-law Number 150-2021 on December 21, 2021; and

Whereas Council of the City of Kenora adopted the 2022 Municipal Operating Budget by passing By-law Number 49-2022 on May 17, 2022; and

Whereas at a Regular Committee of the Whole meeting held July 12, 2022 Council recommended a budget amendment in the amount of \$33,075.00, plus HST, of which \$8,740 is to be funded through the Parking Meter Reserves, and the balance of 24,335 + total HST is to be funded through the Parkade/Parking Rentals Reserve to upgrade the metered parking kiosk machine technology to EMV-enabled credit card transactions; and

Whereas public notice of this amendment has been given in accordance with Notice By-law Number 144-2007;

Now Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kenora Hereby enacts as follows:

- 1. That Council hereby authorizes a budget amendment in the amount of \$33,075.00, plus HST, of which \$8,740 is to be funded through the Parking Meter Reserves, and the balance of 24,335 + total HST is to be funded through the Parkade/Parking Rentals Reserve to upgrade the metered parking kiosk machine technology to EMV-enabled credit card transactions.
- 2. That the 2022 Municipal Capital and Operating Budgets be and are hereby amended for this purpose.
- That this By-law shall come into force and take effect on final passing.
