PROSPECTORS' CLASS.

A class for miners, prospectors and all others interested in mining will be instituted here shortly by Mr. W. Hamilton Merritt, F. G. S., of Toronto. The class will take up the following subjects: Chemistry, mineralogy, geology, prospecting, the using of the blowpipe, panning, assaying, etc. The amount of chemistry the lectures will embrace will be enough to understand what a mineral is and will be made illustrative by experiments. The science of mineralogy will be gone into so far as to distinguish the common minerals, by sight and to make field tests. The geological part will include the formation of the different minerals together with the elements of lithology and petrology, in so far as to appreciate the distinction of common varieties of rocks. Mining and milling particularly with regard to prospecting and preliminary work will be thoroughly taught with diagrams, etc. The blowpipe will be occupied and its use carefully taught while panning will be made easy. How to make an assay of gold and silver will be shown. To make the lectures more practical trips will be made to different mines and ore dumps where those instructed will have an opportunity of witnessing on their minds the lectures.

This class is one that should not be missed by anyone who wishes to do more care to follow up mining. The lectures are highly interesting and will be a great source of instruction to those attending. If you desire to join hand in your name to James Weisman, Record office.

BIG DEAL.

Reduction Works and Black Jack Gold Properties Sold.

Bruswitz, who has been here some time and acting for the company, concluded the deal through Messrs. Ann and Hay. The company intend renovating the whole interior of the works and equipping it with the newest and most improved machinery and will treat all ores reported on by all parties interested. Some new buildings will be erected, the plans of which will be seen at Mr. Ahn's office on Main street, and work is likely to commence in a few days. The plant will be in working order, it is anticipated, within the next two months.

REGINA MINE.

Mr. W. G. Motley, M.E., is an energetic mining man in reality, a hustler in every sense of the word. At the Regina mine things present a busy scene.
