## VODKA CONFUSES RATS, TOO

## Many Inquiries, No Complaints By American Tourists

Mr. A. J. Sherrett, Tourist and Publicity representative for Kenora reports that the last Sport Show of the season closed at Dallas, Texas, on Sunday night, with a new record attendance of 82,000 an increase of approximately 33%, the highest increase of any Sport Show reported this year.

Kenora's representatives were pleased with the results and the many enthusiastic inquiries received.

Hundreds of people spoke of having been to the Lake of the Woods, and of their intention to

return, while others said that they had heard glowing reports of the area and its fishing, and were planning to come up and visit this season.

NOT ONE COMPLAINT was received regarding accommodation rates etc. and innumerable compliments received regarding "wonderful hospitality" "marvelous fishing" and the "amazing scenery" brought a glow of satisfaction and a deep sense of pride in the area and its wonderful attractions.

Publicity was generous and full of praise. Only three other Canadian Booths were in the show, all private. One was from Manitoba, from Cranberry Portage, and one from Cree Lake, Saskatchewan. Another, from Frobisher Bay in the Canadian Arctic, 1400 miles north-east of Montreal, cal-

led "Chartic Lodge", where the famous "Char" fish is caught. The charges at this last resort being \$1500.00 per week, with Eskimo guides being used.

A few more publicity visits to various Towns and business will wind up a successful publicity tour before the Kenora representatives arrive home.

## Put Clocks Ahead 1 Hour Tonight For Daylight Saving

Residents of Kenora and Keewatin will lose an hour's sleep over the weekend but gain an extra hour's sunshine from Sunday through to October 31st.

Daylight Saving Time arrives officially in Kenora and Keewatin at 12.01 a.m. Sunday, April 26th, clocks should be moved ahead an hour at that time, or if one happens to be an "early-to-bedder" tonight, the clock should be set back then.

Kenora and Keewatin will change back to Central Standard time again at midnight, Saturday October 31st.

Fort Frances also goes on Daylight Time as does Dryden along with most centres across the country in eight Canadian provinces. Alberta and Prince Edward Island stick to Standard time all year round as do the Yukon and Northwest Territories.

# MUSIC FESTIVAL OPENS MONDAY MORNING

Monday morning will see the opening of the second section of the sixteenth annual Kenora district music festival, featuring vocal, instrumental and choral classes. The festival executive is fortunate in having secured the services of three highly qualified adjudicators, all from Winnipeg, Mr. Filmer Hubble who will adjudicate instrumental classes, Mr. Glen Harrison, choirs and Mrs. Berythe Birse vocal classes.

Competitions will be held in the Legion Auditorium, Presbyterian Church hall and Masonic Hall in the daytime and in the high school auditorium evenings. With more than 500 entries and over 3,000 individual competitors, classes will be held every day with the exception of Friday and for three evenings.

Friday evening will be the

grand finale concert highlighted by the awarding of major awards and trophies. This will include the Vocal Rose Bowl and accompanying scholarship of \$100 donated by the Rotary Club and the Instrumental Rose Bowl and scholarship of \$100 donated by the Lions Club. A total of twelve cups and shields will be presented.

The record entry will include competitors from Dryden, Eagle River, Minnitaki, Sioux Lookout, Vermilion Bay, Wabigoon, Rennie Manitoba, as well as Keewatin and Kenora. Private cars and buses will transport children to and from Kenora, with a special committee to look after the needs of visitors while in Kenora.

At the conclusion of the festival Friday, it is expected that well over 6,000 individuals from all parts of the district will have taken part. Section one, which was held in February and which featured, folk dancing and public speaking, drama, spoken poetry and choral reading saw the largest entry yet in these classes.

President, Mrs. W. Kidd and her executive, Mrs. M. Burns of Kenora and Mrs. E. Marr of Dryden, vice presidents, Mrs. M. Eurtig and Mrs. R. A. Einarson - secretaries and Mr. C. V. Lee treasurer have worked exceedingly hard to ensure the success of this festival. Mrs. Kidd stated today that she is confident this will be one of the finest festivals experienced by this town.

The Movement, which, in 1878, became known as The Salvation Army, originated in The Christian Mission meetings conducted in London, thirteen years previous, by the Rev. William Booth. Its primary aim is to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ to men and women untouched by ordinary religious efforts. As Jan MacLaren once declared: "The Salvation Army makes religion where there was no religion before."

The Christian Mission grew beyond all expectation. In due course, in the interests of more effective "warfare" against evil, a military form of organization, with uniforms and other distinctive features, was adopted.

To reach the multitudes who would not enter a place of worship, open-air meetings and marches were organized. Flags, brass bands and religious songs

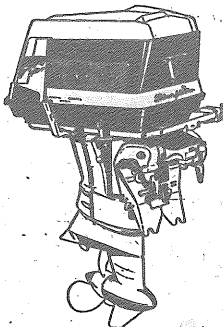
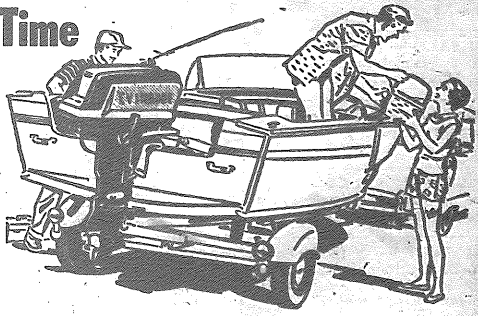

## Don't Sow Weed Seeds

Maybe it's sounding a new note to suggest that killing or controlling weeds can be unprofitable. Nevertheless, the time has arrived when we can no longer afford to kill weeds just for the satisfaction of it. We must control them for a specific desirable result, and, in the main, that result must be bigger and better crops, says the Field Crops Branch of the Ontario Department of Agriculture. Otherwise, the weed control becomes an unprofitable expense.

The main reason weeds cause reduced crop returns is the competition they give the crop for space, sunlight, moisture, and plant nutrients. The effect of this competition is greatest when crop plants are small. In the crops of wheat, oats, and barley, competition occurs when the crop plants are in the four-to-six-leaf stage. Therefore, to be most profitable, weed populations should be eliminated at that time. In the case of corn, the damage caused by weeds is most pronounced at tasseling stage.

This illustrates particularly the importance of eliminating weeds BEFORE they've done the damage to the crop they're sharing the field with. Primarily, control starts with weed-free seeds. Weed-free seed is basic to clean farming and without it all other forms of weed control are wholly inadequate. Weed seeds planted with the crop on a well-prepared, well-fertilized seed bed germinate on the instalment plan - some this year some next year - so that no matter what post-seeding treatment is followed this one misdeed will haunt the careless sower for many years. First step in profitable weed control: "Don't Sow Weed Seeds".

The animals all had made a break when a circus trailer truck overturned. All were recaptured except the guan bird and one Indian goat, killed by motorists who didn't see them in time.

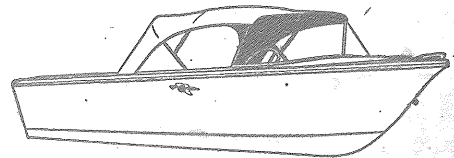
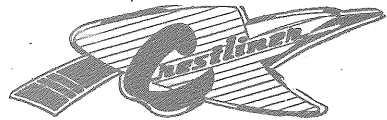
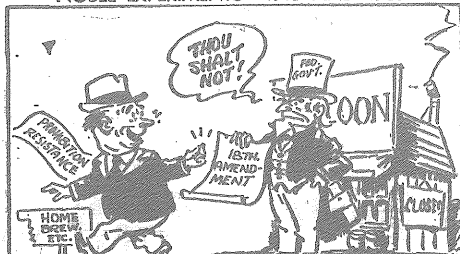

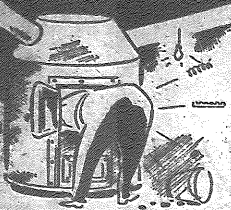
ESKIMO CHILDREN CLOSE TO TEARS AS THEY RETURN TO ARCTIC

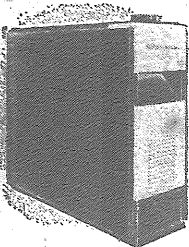

**Battle Of Atlantic To Be Marked Sunday, May 3**

Battle of the Atlantic Sunday will be observed across Canada on May 3, in memory of those who served and those who gave their lives at sea in the Second World War.

Church parades and special services will be held in naval commands and establishments, from coast to coast, and in ships at sea, commemorating the long and bitter battle for control of the North Atlantic. In the winning of this battle, Canadian ships and men played a major part.

May 3, will also mark the opening of Navy Week under the auspices of the Navy League of Canada. Royal Canadian Sea Cadets will be on parade during the week and in many communities Sea Cadet establishments will hold "open house."
