tients wife to visit with him in Fort William. These people have had great difficulties and the request was immediately fulfilled. The mental depression that was overcome and the almost certain fact that this man was prevented from possibly leaving before his full treatment was finished; certainly merited the cost to our Assoc.

In May the cash balance in the Rehabilitation fund was brought up to a total of \$100.00. This was to establish a readily available fund for travelling expenses and urgent needs from the San.

At our following meeting I introduced Mrs. Doug Lemoine who has kindly consented to help me with this work. I feel that with Marion's help and her background of a Public Health Nurse in this area the Assoc. has acquired a valuable new member.

In May I visited the patients at the San and found now that they were bringing the problems to me and really seemed to enjoy my visits. There were 125 patients in the San, then from our District. During these visits there are many problems that come up. Some of them are petty because when one has nothing to do but think of oneself, things get out of perspective but I listen and pick out the important ones and try to assist wherever possible. As we visit, we distribute cigarettes, candy, stationery, shaving soap, etc. wherever the need is great. After each trip we phone as many of the parents and wives of the local patients as we can contact. These people are very grateful for our sincere interest.

We also have many requests during the year from the Nursing Supt. for assistance to purchase eye-glasses, pyjamas, bath robes, slippers etc. and these are immediately granted.

Much of the Rehab. work has proven to be a Social Service line but it all assists the patient to recover, improve his mental outlook while in the San. We strive to help wherever possible to assist him return home and remain well. The only frustration is that we are not able to do nearly enough because the work required is too great a job for any local association but this is a step in the right direction.

TO ALL BOAT OWNERS AND OPERATORS ON LAKE OF THE WOODS

At this time of the summer season when numerous gas boats and pleasure craft are operating and company tug boats are towing pulpwood and logs, we respectfully solicit your co-operation in our endeavour to keep the lake clear of floating pulpwood, logs and dead heads. When gas boats run too close to a tow of pulp or logs, the swell has a tendency to wash out some of the pulp and logs, and it is for this reason that we ask you to:

- (1) When passing a tow, either being towed by tugs or in storage, keep at least 100 feet from boom. When it is not possible to do this, if in narrows, slow down till past the tow or boom.
- (2) When following a tow of pulp or logs, watch for any stray logs or pulpwood sticks which may have worked out from rear of tow.

If these precautions are observed by all boat owners, it will keep the lake free from floaters and will help eliminate damage to small craft.
