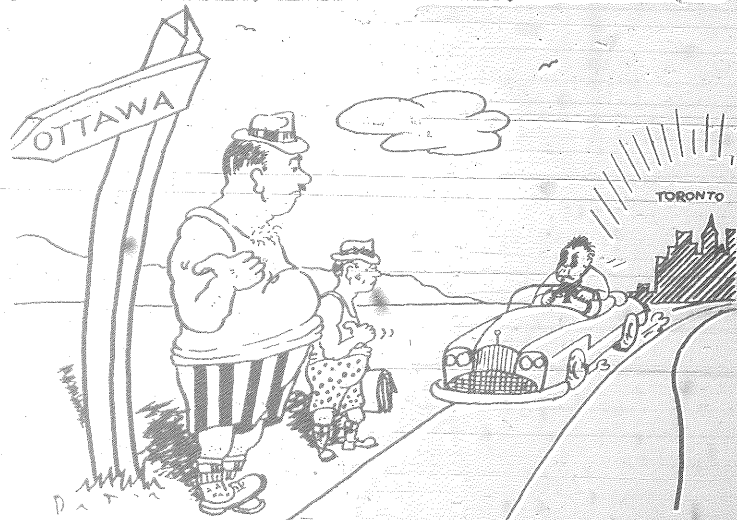

### TAKES LONGER TO REACH THE AIRPORT

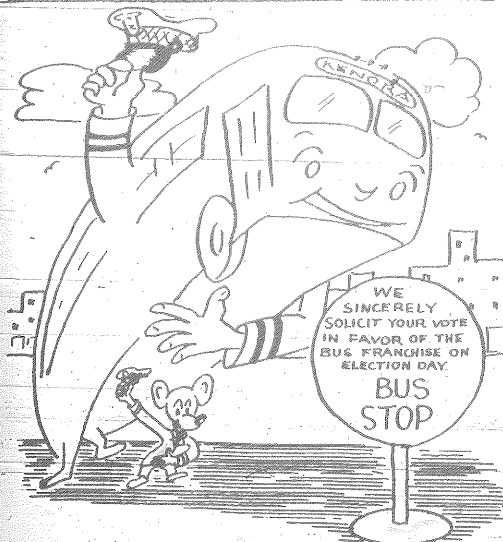
**LONDON** — Why does it take longer to drive out to London airport than to fly from there to Paris?

When the laughter ended, Sandys rejected monorail or helicopter service to the airport as too costly.

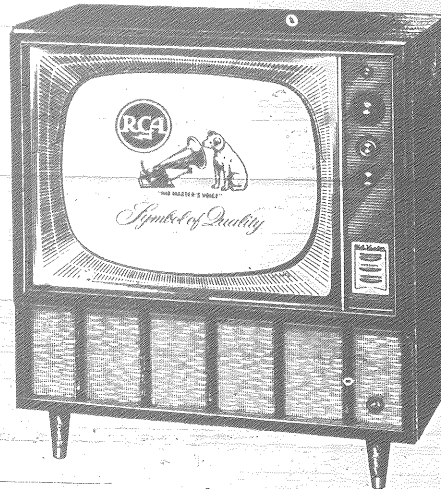
He said current road improvements should cut the trip to 23 to 25 minutes. It now takes about an hour in daytime traffic. Paris is less than an hour away by plane.

3. Car headlights, however efficient, can never give the same driving safety as daylight, points out the Ontario Safety League. The fatal accident rate is much higher in hours of darkness. The remedy is obvious - the switching-on of headlights is a signal for less speed, more care.

4. Speed is a relative, not an absolute quantity. The Ontario Safety League points out that driving at 40 m.p.h. close behind the bumper of another car is much more dangerous than 60 m.p.h. on a good, clear highway.

5. When you have to stop for a wig-wag, keep at least 30 feet from the tail truck, recommends the Ontario Safety League. That way if another driver crashes you from behind (and it does happen) you avoid the possibility of being forced into the path of the train.

### F.F. 18 YEAR OLD TAKES OWN LIFE

PORT FRANKLIN, Ont. (Erickson, 18, ended his life with a gunshot at his Port Franklin home Saturday evening. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Erickson, Victoria Avenue.

Town police learned that he had been drinking and that he had threatened to shoot himself. No inquest was scheduled although a post-mortem examination was to be held.

Erickson is survived by his parents and four younger brothers and sisters.

2 cups white sugar

1/2 tsp salt  
Juice of one lemon  
2 lbs. bleached softening butter  
1/2 lb. colored candied fruit  
1/2 lb. candied cherries  
1/2 lb. candied orange peel

Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs and beat. Sift flour, baking powder and salt and sift over fruit and nuts in a large bowl. Mix milk first as all rested. Beat fruit and flour mixture into the creamed mixture. Pour into prepared pan and bake in slow oven at 275 deg. to 300 deg. for 3 to 3 1/2 hours.

**Nuclear Power Project Reaches Half-Way Mark**

Construction of Canada's first nuclear electric generating station has reached the half-way mark.

The \$20-million Nuclear Power Demonstration (NPD) project, being built by Atomic Energy of Canada Limited, Canadian General Electric Company Limited, and Ontario Hydro, entered a new stage last month as contractors began installation of mechanical and electrical equipment in the powerhouse.

First components of the station's 20,000 kilowatt conventional turbo-generator arrived at the site late in November. Installation of this equipment and the cooling and moderator piping for the nuclear reactor will start this month. The Canadian-designed and built reactor will use natural uranium as a fuel and heavy water as coolant and moderator.

NPD is scheduled to begin delivering power to Ontario Hydro's South Ontario system by mid-1969.

A construction force of approximately 230 is working at the 500-acre Ottawa River site 20 miles upstream from Chalk River and 150 miles northwest of Ottawa.

Structural work on the L-

plant houses is nearly finished. The main building, 272 by 280 feet, will contain the generating hall and control, service and administration wings.

The reactor itself will be housed in a concrete vault approximately 30 feet below ground. Excavation for the structure involved the removal of nearly 20,000 cubic yards of soil. The pouring of 12,000 cubic yards of concrete for the substructure continued through last winter in below-zero temperatures. Lowest point below ground is the dump tank room, nearly 85 feet down.

The powerhouse, situated on the river bank about 250 feet from the main building, will supply the gallons of water a minute for cooling purposes. The water will not come in contact with radioactive materials and will be discharged into the Ottawa River in a pure but warmer state.

When in service, NPD will need a staff of approximately 500 to

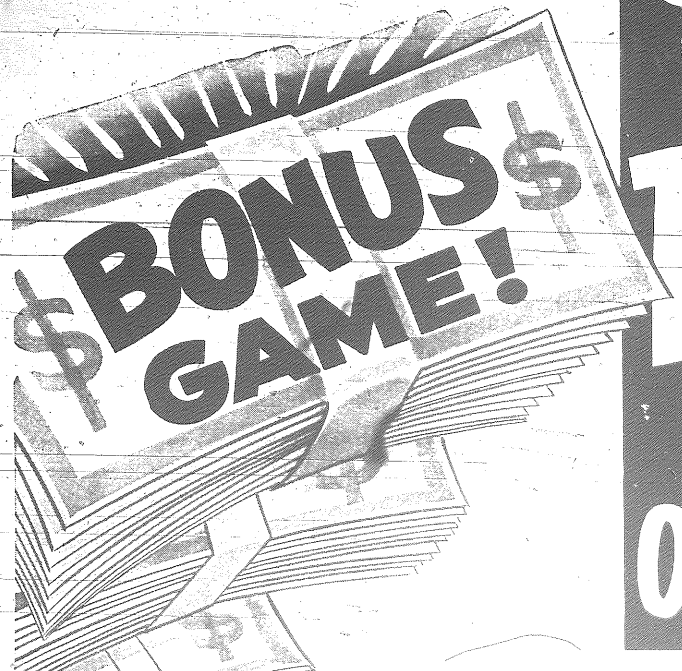

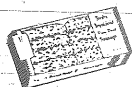

**Help Yourself To A Better Memory**

AS we have seen, memory, and the factors which affect it, vary from individual to individual. We all start off with the same basic raw material, but the way in which we set about acquiring a good memory will depend to a large extent upon our own needs, personality, interests and memory type. There are, however, certain basic rules which can put us on the right road to a better memory.

1. **CONFIDENCE:** When we start to feel desperate about how forgetful we are, we should stop to consider just how much of a chance we are giving our memories. The more we sit back and say "I just can't remember any thing," the less we will be able to remember.

Be confident that your memory will give you rich dividends for every effort you make to train it. Trust your memory and make full use of it. By assuming a positive approach and saying to yourself, "I'm going to remember this," you are turning the key to a storage file in your mind.

2. **INTEREST:** Everyone is interested in something, be it people, horse races, or quantitative analysis, and we find that we can more easily remember what we read, hear or see about our pet subjects.

If you have a passion for old

cuts, you will find that you give complete attention to any information that comes your way on that particular subject, and you will probably have no difficulty in recalling any of that information.

It is the subjects in which we have little or no interest that we have the greatest trouble remembering. While some of us are naturally enthusiastic and excited about a great number of pursuits—others are inclined to stick to a few interests to the exclusion of all else. However, you will find that if you rememberable dividends to broaden your field of interest as regularly as you can. New interests promote new friends, new thoughts and new memories.

3. **ATTENTION:** When our teachers used to say to us "pay attention," we would have been bringing our wool-gathering minds back to the subject at hand and concentrate on what was being said. It is a good habit to get out that their pupils had no hope of remembering words to which they were in no way attending. It might be well if we had some part of our mind saying "pay attention" now that we are adults.

That old "memory game" we played at children's parties illustrates just how much attentiveness can help our memories. The hostess used to bring in a small white envelope containing a pin, a can opener, a letter, a pair of scissors, and so on. Each guess would then contain an object to be observed for three minutes and then written down as many of the objects as he could remember after the tray had been taken away.

Often we would surprise ourselves at the number of items we could write down on our slip of paper. If we analyze this, we can see the reasons we observed "wisely" — we concentrated on remembering... and we had decided in advance that we intended to remember. Think how much more we would be able to remember if we put these three rules to work for us in our everyday experience. Even a little practice they could be turned on automatically each time our brain registered the fact that an item should be stored away in our memories.

4. **REPETITION:** It has been discovered that we forget things most rapidly shortly after we have learned them. Therefore if we wish to remember a fact we must keep repeating it to our selves until it is firmly established in our mind.

This practice is particularly helpful in remembering names. Unless the introduction is very rushed, there is usually time for at least a short conversation with a new acquaintance. If you give your mind a little practice, you can soon gain a knowledge of the introduction, during the conversation and when you say goodbye. You'll find it will stick in your memory.

5. **SUPPLEMENTATION:** Remembering a series of distinct facts from a single auditory impression is difficult. But, after having written the instructions down on paper, they become readily in our minds. By supplying the impression with another that is heard and seeing we are much more likely to remember.

For this reason, salesmen carry off a little notebook handy in which they jot down names of prospects they meet during the day's business. Unless they have particularly well-trained memories, they have found they cannot rely solely on the spoken word to imprint the name in their minds. But the combination of two different impressions plants it there securely.

**JUDGE GETS FAST ACTION FROM JURY**

Nottingham, Eng. — A judge with a train to catch warned his jury that they would be locked up for the night if they could not make up their minds in 10 minutes.

Seventy-one-year-old Mr. Justice Stable recalled the jury, which had been out for two hours and 20 minutes, and told them:

"I have disorganized my private arrangements out of consideration of you pretty considerably—and I am not going to disorganize them any further."

"Use your common-sense and don't worry yourselves with legal quibbles."

The jury filed out—and returned within four minutes with their verdict—guilty.

The judge then rushed off to catch his train.

An appeal in the case, involving the theft of television sets, is considered likely.

**AIRLINE COMPANIES COMBINE SERVICES FOR OVERSEAS TRIPS**

MONTREAL — It was announced jointly today by TCA and BOAC that in the interests of providing improved service to the

public, an agreement has been reached between TCA and BOAC. The agreement was reached by G. R. McGregor, president of TCA, and Mr. Basil Smallpiece, managing director of BOAC.

This agreement will ensure that the services between Canada and the United Kingdom will be offered at times best suited to the needs of the expanding public demand. It will also provide for the integration of schedules between Canada and the U.K. and of other passenger and cargo services, including the interchangeability of tickets. The offices of both companies will conduct business on behalf of each other.

The agreement reached will come into effect March 1, 1960.

## Elliot Lake Teachers Resign from Posts

**ELLIOT LAKE, Ont.**—The public school board here announced Monday that 43 of the 58 teachers in local public schools, including all but one of the principals, have resigned.

The notices take effect Dec. 31, the end of the school term. They were received in the mail Friday by the board in this improvement district midway between Sudbury and Sault Ste. Marie.

The supervising principal is among the 15 who have not resigned.

In Toronto, J. E. Fisher, assistant secretary of the Ontario Public School Men Teachers' Federation, said the resignations may have been submitted because of dissatisfaction over the length of salary negotiations and the lack of a settlement.

The decision, he said, was made by the Elliot Lake teachers.

"We have been unable to get what we considered an adequate salary schedule," Mr. Fisher said. "Salary negotiations between the federation and the board have broken down."

In a statement Monday, the school board said it does not know the reasons for the resignations.

"Within the last three weeks," said the statement, "most negotiations regarding the introduction of the category system with accompanying salary increases and adjustments had been completed, with the exception of one minor issue which did not involve teachers with permanent certificates."

"The agreement... had the full approval of the Ontario School Trustees Council and the department of municipal affairs. During negotiations an adjustment costing \$2,000 a year was

granted, effective September, 1959. The final agreement... will cost an additional \$13,000 a year, to be effective Jan. 1960."

The board called a meeting of members Sunday to "determine what the problems are." The teacher negotiations, which have continued for six months, included teachers not to attend, but the board was told that no protest existed at the local level.

"Needless to say," the statement says, "the board is extremely disappointed and disturbed that so many of their teachers saw fit to take this unusual step."

Board chairman C.B. Hart said in an interview that salaries here are on a par with those in Sudbury, North Bay, Espanola and other nearby districts.

The meeting called for Sunday was to find out if there were any "hot spots," and was in no sense a negotiation meeting.

## MACHINE GETS TOO BIG-HEARTED

Last Friday a bank in Holyoke issued a cheque for \$1,000,022.75—over-size by \$1,000,000. The bank fired the girl teller responsible.

In Cambridge, city treasurer Frederick J. Reardon rectified the error and chuckled.

"Why should anyone be fired?" he said. "Everybody makes mistakes."
