Sudbury—The average hunter spent \$540 for every moose shot in the province, Ontario Lands Minister Spooner said Tuesday night.

The minister told the annual dinner of the Northern Ontario Tourist Outfitters Association that during the 1958 season some \$3,864,500 changed hands

during the annual moose hunt. This meant money in the pockets of every businessman located anywhere near a moose hunting area.

The minister said that improved survey techniques and continuing hunter reports made it easier for the government to estimate big game populations. But he criticized the outfitters and licence issuers for delaying their reports in 1958 and said these delays, especially in connection with deer hunting, made a proper survey impossible.

A 1953 survey showed the moose population in Northern Ontario to be 42,000 and that since that time the moose count had been building steadily.

He said the government has started a study of the wintering of deer which will be a permanent continuing assessment of conditions and effect which will aid in determining the need for following years.

The government also has adopted a policy of setting seasons

for the moose hunt. This meant money in the pockets of every businessman located anywhere near a moose hunting area.

Our population of 15,000 probably was barely sufficient to qualify for so large an expenditure as has been made, and which must continue to be made each year for operations. Our hard working citizens who persisted in pressing our case before the senior government, was, without doubt, an important factor.

While bouquets are being handed out, it should be mentioned too, that Kenora's station is second-to-none in quality. Apart from a lower power output in the transmitters, no corners have been cut. We have today the finest of equipment on Tunnel Island and a feeder microwave link from East Hawk Lake which is of the highest quality. ### Alaska Hopes To Export Gas

By EDNA ATKINSON  
ANCHORAGE, Alaska (Reuter) — The problem of keeping warm in this sub-Arctic area long has been met by a supply

line of ocean tankers and trucks transporting expensive liquid fuels to Alaskan consumers. Now the Kenai Peninsula seems about to produce natural gas. Announcements by Union Oil of California and Ohio Oil companies say commercially exploitable natural gas reserves have been found in the Swanson River fields. Inhabitants of Anchorage hope, by switching over to gas, to benefit by an estimated 25-per-cent re-

duction in fuel costs. That they will provide a market is seen in the overwhelming approval shown in a municipal ballot for a 20-year gas franchise proposal. **CONTRACT SIGNED.** Officials of the new Anchorage Gas Company have signed a contract with Union Oil and Ohio Oil to supply natural gas to the Anchorage area from the Kenai Peninsula fields. The target date for the start of delivery is December, 1961. It will require a 165-mile pipeline to bring the gas from the fields to Alaska's largest city. The natural gas field is situated in the Kalifornsky Beach

area of the peninsula. Meanwhile, Standard Oil Company of California has announced plans to spend \$3,000,000 on exploration in 1960 and form a new 70,000-acre drilling unit near Soldotna, also on the Kenai Peninsula. The Standard Company has plans to lay a pipeline if total production can be sustained at 3,000 barrels a day. **OTHER OPERATIONS.** Elsewhere, exploratory operations are to get under way near the old Eskimo village of Nulato, on the Yukon River. In southwestern Alaska, a development contract of 465,000

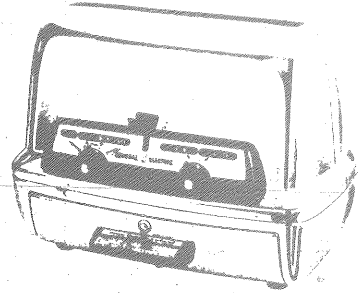
acres in the Kuskokwim-Bethel basin has been awarded to the Pan American Petroleum Corporation. Called the Napatak Creek division contract, the stipulation is that Pan American must spend a minimum of \$950,000 for exploration and drill three wells, beginning the first week before March, 1961. **FISH SHORTAGE.** BELGRADE — Yugoslavia is sending a fishing fleet to the Atlantic, because of a shortage of fish in local Adriatic waters. Yugoslavia has had to import fish since 1934.

The season now is Sept. 1-June 15 and the association wants the lands and forests department to extend it to June 30 in areas north of the CNR transcontinental line.

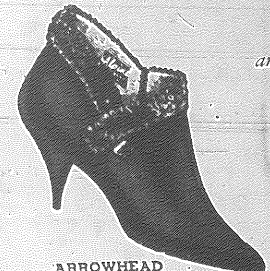
Bears hibernate longer in the north and the limited season prevents hunters from killing more of the animals, the resolution said.

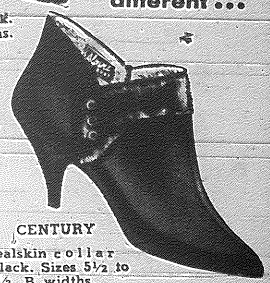

**HOLLYWOOD** —Ed Wynn had a birthday last week. The records show that he's 73. He says he's 57.

In a way, both figures are correct. The reasoning behind this helps explain why Ed is enjoying one of show business' busiest careers at an age when many men are doddering around in retirement.

"Legally, I am 73; mentally, I am 57," he said with utter seriousness. "I know it sounds crazy, but it works!"

"It started when I was doing

my first dramatic role, in 'The Great Man.' I came on the set and everyone kept treating me like an old relic. They kept hoving chairs under me and asking me if I was all right."

**REALLY AGGRAVATED**

"I got mad. I'm not by nature a profane man, but I started swearing at them and telling them to stop acting as though I was ready to fall apart."

"I decided that I would not be treated like an old man. I would pick another time for my birthday, an occasion that was both

joyful and important. Perhaps if I could convince myself of this by a peculiar form of self-hypnosis, then I could also convince others that I was not so darned old."

The date he picked was the most significant in his life: Aug. 8, 1902, the day he first stepped onto a stage.

"I actually think I am 57 years old," he said. "The self-hypnosis has worked. Of course, I'm not going to do anything foolish. I wouldn't go out with 18-year-old girls, as I might have when I was really 57."

"I know I'm not 57 in my body, but I think I am 57 up here (tapping his head). How else would I be able to do calisthenics like this every morning? (He

touched his fingers to the floor.) How else could I be reading three scripts at one time? How else could I pursue my ambition to be a really good dramatic actor? I wouldn't have the nerve if I thought I was 73."

Ed has even come to the extent of tossing a birthday party for himself on Aug. 8. He was slightly annoyed when son Keenan showed up on the Candelita set with a birthday cake last week. Ed himself made no observance of his actual natal day.

He admitted that his theory is not fully developed as yet. But he is such a convincing advocate that he has already prompted a dozen people to adopt his plan.

"Take the woman approaching 40," he cited. "She dreads that age, because it makes her seem to be growing old. How much better she would feel if she chose a happy event when she was 9 or 10—say, her confirmation—and made that her birthday!"

### Could Be Illegal To Give Firearms To Kids For Xmas

The Ontario Department of Lands and Forests during 1959 sponsored a Hunter Safety Training Program. The program has taken shape and through the help of many Conservation Clubs, courses for juveniles in safe gun handling have been conducted in most villages, towns and cities throughout Ontario. Training

such as that given through these organized courses will no doubt result in starting young hunters off on the right foot and will probably reduce the number of hunting accidents.

In Ontario, hunting licences are not available to persons under the age of 16 years. Yet many a young boy, say perhaps from 12 to 16 years of age, will receive a firearm or an air rifle as a Christmas gift. When a gift of this nature is received, it is only natural that the receiver tries it out. Legal requirements such as obtaining licences and receiving training on the safe use of firearms are of no concern to a young fellow in this age bracket who may find a shiny new .22 rifle under the Christmas tree on Christmas morning.

Parents who may have such a gift in mind for Junior are reminded that: (1) It is a criminal offence to purchase or give a firearm to a juvenile under 14 years of age; (2) no licence to carry a firearm can be obtained until Junior reaches the age of 16 and (3) a certificate of competence issued by a certified instructor, verifying the fact that the juvenile has completed a course of instruction on safe gun handling, must be obtained.

The Department of Lands and Forests' timely suggestion to parents who anticipate giving a firearm as a gift to Junior this Christmas is to make sure that he holds the necessary qualifications.

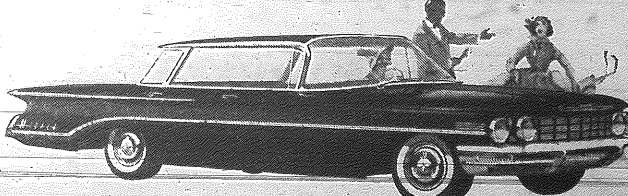

### "Payola" Probers Indicate Hearings Slated For 1960

WASHINGTON — No disc jockeys have yet been called to testify in Washington, a House subcommittee source says, because no date has been set for hearings into the "payola" racket. "Subcommittee investigators

have gone out of town to question several disc jockeys, "but we haven't asked any to come here yet."

The subcommittee on legislation oversight is expected to set a date for hearings on payola when it meets December 9 on an unrelated matter. The hearings probably will come early next year.

Payola is the practice of bribing some disc jockeys with money or gifts to play certain records and help make them popular. In New York, the American

Guild of Authors and Composers said payola to disc jockeys is "merely a symptom . . . in a letter to chairman John C. Dierker of the Federal Communications Commission, guild chief Burton Lane said:

"The disease itself is the involvement of the entire broadcasting industry, including the networks and local stations, in a deliberate and successful distortion of music programming for their own financial gains."

Mr. Lane noted that Dick Clark, Philadelphia disc jockey, was ordered by his ABC network to divest himself of outside music business interests.

Mr. Lane called this a "travesty on logic" because "ABC is permitted to own and operate far greater music interests of its own, which include the important recording company, known as Am-Par Record Corporation."

Mr. Lane added that "Radio Corporation of America has admitted the use of its licensed stations and facilities to promote the products and talent of its recording company." CBS, he said, also has used "its licensed stations facilities to promote the products and talents of its recording company," Columbia Records.

There was an immediate comment from ABC, RCA, or CBS. The American Guild of Authors and Composers include such figures as Oscar Hammerstein, Ira Gershwin, and Cole Porter in its membership.

**INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION**

Overall output of industry in Canada reached a new peak in November this year, measured by the Bureau's seasonally adjusted index. This index rose 2.3% from August, with manufacturing production showing a gain of 3.2%, mineral output up 6.8%, and electricity and gas output 3.9% higher.

**MINING**

Production of copper, nickel, silver and lead was larger in the first nine months this year than last, output of gold, zinc and coal smaller.

**MANUFACTURING**

Steel pipe production set a new record in the week ended November 21, exceeding eight months' factory shipments of motor vehicles to the end of October were 12% greater this year than last, output of pulp and paper in slowest since 1952, increase of 5% per cent over a year earlier.

## Choose Xmas Tree And Decorations With Special Care

Christmas trees, symbol of gaiety and happiness, too often become a mass of flames and a symbol of disaster, according to the All-Canada Insurance Federation.

Trees, decorations, and special Christmas costumes should all be chosen with special care and protected from fire. The Federation, which represents more than 250 Canadian fire, automobile and casualty insurance companies, makes these recommendations for safety in the home during the Christmas season:

1. Choose a small Christmas tree; it will be less hazardous than a larger one.
2. Keep the base of the tree in a "container" of water; the water will be absorbed and keep the tree moist.
3. Keep trees away from stoves, heaters and fireplaces.
4. Use good quality electric lights on the tree, not candles.
5. Check your lights for any defects which might cause short circuits.
6. Be sure that Christmas lights do not overload the electrical circuits in your home.
7. Keep papers, gifts and other inflammable articles away from the base of the tree until Christmas eve.
8. Do not use paper, gauze like materials or other highly inflammable cloths for childrens costumes.
9. Check carefully for burning cigarette butts after every party or gathering in your home.
10. Always turn off electric tree lights when room is unoccupied.

And this is not easy, the plugs say. Food products sometimes need extra coloring or other aids under brilliant, hot studio lights. A lot of photo values are also lost in TV transmission, and this must be reckoned with in advance.

That frothy foam on beer could be whipped egg whites. A shorter lasting head is created if warm beer is poured into a glass that has been lined with a thin coat of glycerine, melted butter or soap.

Somebody in the bubble bath is wearing a bra and tights beneath the thick suds. Also unseen is the man who makes the bubbles with a hose connected to an air compressor.

Did you ever wonder why those cakes with the thick icing never seem to crumble when cut? The cake has been sliced beforehand, then recaked with icing.







### TV SALES TREND LOOK FOR 5% RISE IN ANNUAL SALES

Starting next year, television set sales should rise steadily by about 5% yearly, an industry executive says.

This growth would be on basis of "a growing replacement market, coupled with demand for second sets in the home," according to Stuart D. Brownlee, president of Canadian Admark Corp.

The 1955 volume will likely be off about 2% from 1954 but this will likely be the low point in a downturning curve from the 1953 peak year.

Brownlee points out that industry inventory at end of October (about 16,000 sets) was equal to expected November and December sales. This factor should help to maintain stability in the market.

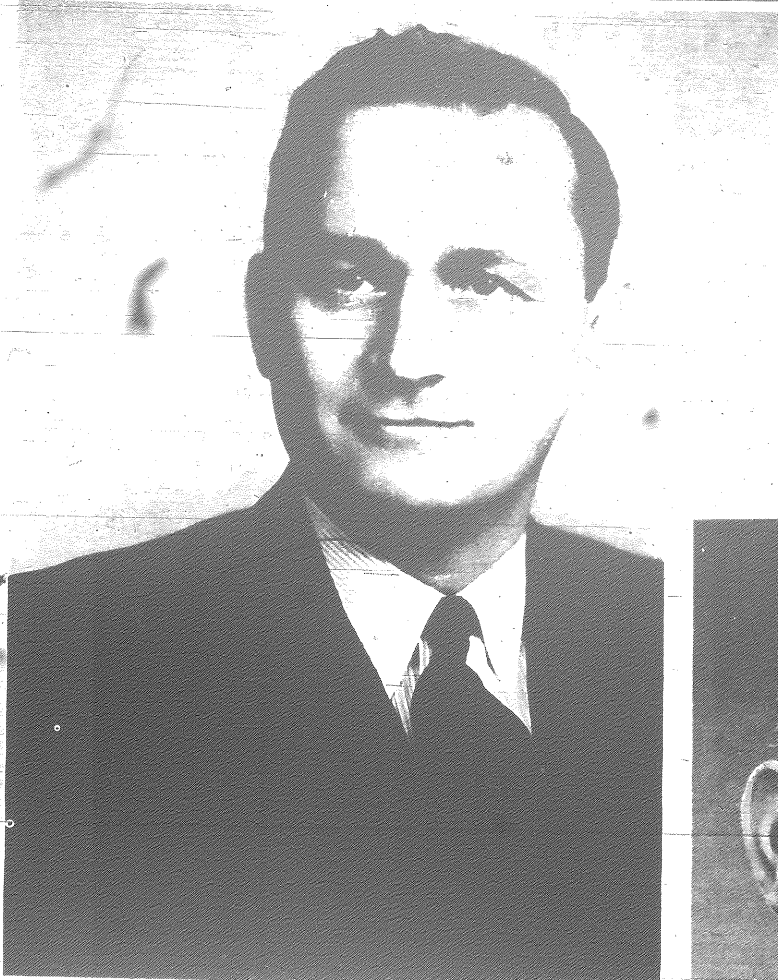

**HOLLYWOOD** The weeks are full of actor-authors these days as book publishers seek the gold already discovered with best sellers by Lillian Roth, Pat Boone, Art Linkletter and others.

The volumes multiply. They range from the sensational to the inspirational. Some are fairly intriguing. Some should never have been written. Nearly all have the same sound—the tinkling of ego orchestrated by a literary aide. The ghost is always present, either sharing billing on the dust jacket or lurking in the misty background.

The Autobiography of Cecil B. Demille is a good view of the public face of the great movie maker. It is written with the same outward dignity with which C. B. spoke, yet he is able to tell stories on himself. Such as the wartime Oscar dinner when he introduced the ambassador from China as "his excellency, the Japanese ambassador." The book gives an interesting account of the film industry's beginnings and workings of the Demille machine. If the man himself fails to emerge, perhaps it is because he was more devoted to legend than reality.

**MAE WEST AND MEN**

Goodness had Nothing to do With It is an almost incredible account of Mae West's man-to-man conquest. "The various men in my life can claim a great many things," she writes, "but never that they had a dull time." Readers may so complain, especially if they reach the entrance of the latter-day muscle-men.

Ed Wynn's Son is one of the better versions of the now-standard confessional type of autobiography. The reason is the intriguing relationship between

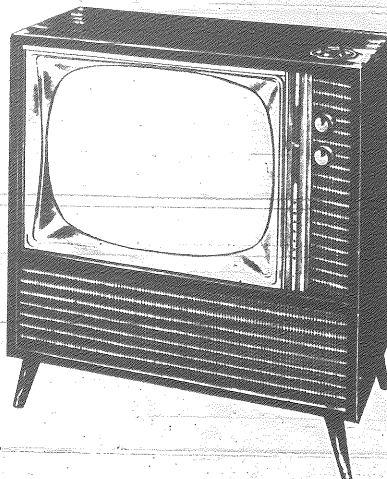

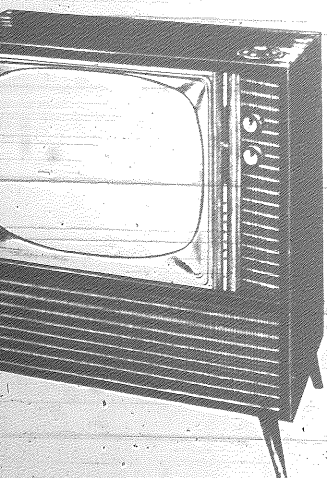
