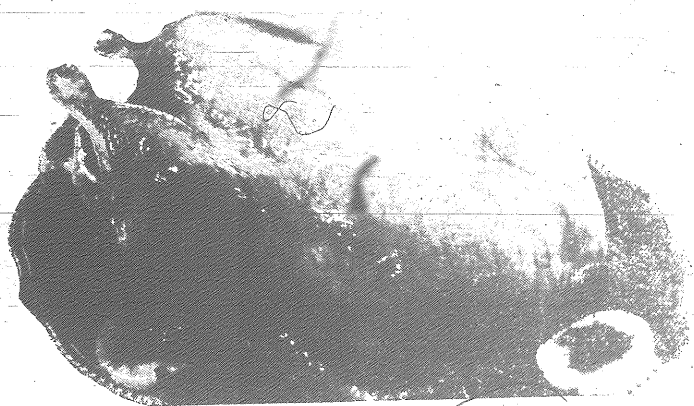

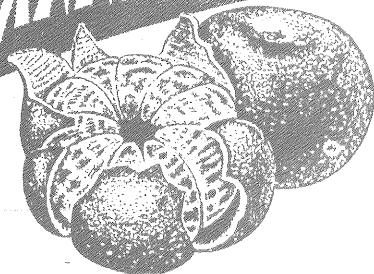

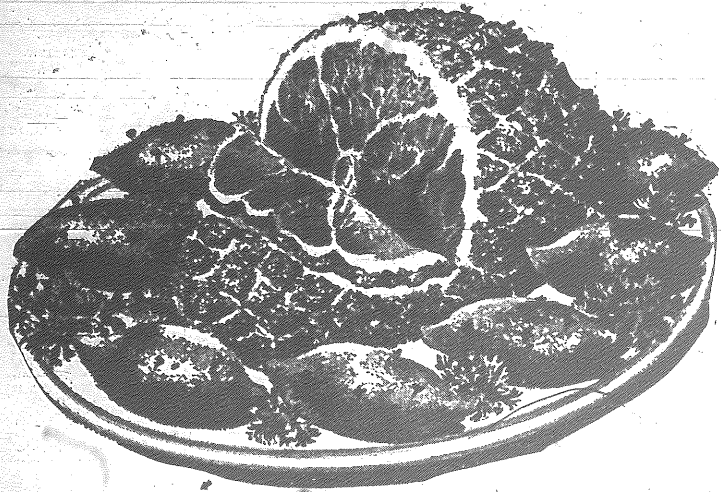

TONSILLECTOMY PERFORMED ON WRONG BOY

TORONTO — A boy was in the operating room, instead of the middle of a tonsillectomy that was being done on a three-year-old boy, when the operating table was moved.

Dr. Thornton, who performed the operation Thursday, "at that time we could do nothing but operate it."

The patient was Ricky Burt, scheduled for a minor skin operation in East General Hospital. His mother, Mrs. William Burt, said she was flabbergasted when told of the error.

She said the surgeon called her and said: "In any case, Ricky will feel much better now."

"He never had a moment's trouble in his life from his tonsils," said Mrs. Burt.

E. E. Willcocks, administrator of the hospital, said there are "10,000 operations a year at this hospital."

"Sooner or later, whatever precautions we take, human error will creep in."

Dr. Steele said Ricky and the three-year-old boy who was to have had the operation were of similar appearance.

"The boy was clearly identified with a label tied on his wrist but I suppose there was some slip-up during the checks which are made before an operation."

Grade 13 Exams Cause Concern; May Change Type

The Ontario department of education will consider the advisability of a new method of assessing marks obtained in grade 13 final examinations, it was revealed in Toronto Saturday.

But, said P. C. Asbury, assistant superintendent of Ontario Secondary School Education, in an address to the first annual conference of the Ontario Educational Research Council, this needs considerable objective as well as the emotional study.

He said it was extremely difficult to set a good examination paper—and as grade 13 papers were extremely important, no one wants to do anything to detract from their usefulness or from the respect in which they are held.

"Nevertheless," he said, "everyone knows results often vary considerably from year to year, having in mind the fact you have a fairly constant factor in teachers and pupils. So what do you do with an examination that is too hard or too easy?"
Mr. Asbury said the way to consideration of the problem would be opened this June when not more than 30 per cent of the material in final examination papers in five subjects would be of the objective question type. The subjects to be affected are chemistry, history, French composition, trigonometry and statistics and zoology.
He said the trend in objective tests was, in turn, the result of the large number of candidates for grade 13 papers, making the question of setting a more difficult problem each year.
"We felt we should find out if possible to what extent the objective style tests would be applicable to grade 13," he said, "in the United States, they have gone over almost exclusively to the objective type."
He added: "We don't want to lose the advantages we have, but there has been a trend towards

marking essay-type questions on the point system so that you might as well have tossed them into the machine."
Mr. Asbury said that several years ago many students got perfect marks in history because of point scoring and, recently, the algebra examination was far too easy. The result is that some adjustment is needed from time to time, so what do you do about scaling?

He said the Ontario Secondary School Teachers Federation had been asked to study the question and submit questions applicable to an objective-type examination. Close to 5,000 replies had been received and passed on to those setting the exams this year.

He said scoring would be done by hand this summer and the marking of objectives as well as essay-type answer would be subject to the supervision of the supervisory board.

He added: No one need be apprehensive that these questions will present any problem to a pupil normally well prepared for examinations.

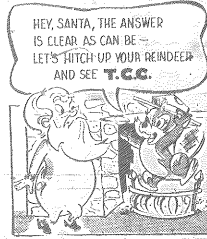
