DARLING OF GAY 90's

**Early Broadway Star
Edna Hopper Dies**

NEW YORK —Edna Wallace Hopper, the toast of Broadway at the turn of the century and later a shrewd stock trader, died Monday of complications of pneumonia.

No one knew her age. Her youthful appearance belied her years. Estimates ranged from 85 to 90. She said the records of her birth were destroyed in the San Francisco earthquake of 1906.

Less than five feet tall and weighing only 85 pounds, Miss Hopper became the darling of the gay '90s, appearing in Broadway shows. Her first big splash was in David Belasco's 'The Girl I Left Behind Me' followed by triumph after triumph here and abroad.

IN FLORODORA

She started in Florodora, which introduced chorus girls to Broad-

way and ran for two years, a spectacular accomplishment in those days. However, Miss Hopper was not one of the famous Florodora girls sextette.

During those years, Miss Hopper married comedian de Wolf Hopper. Until then, her stage name had been Ann Wallace. But she kept the name after the divorce because it had become a public byword.

In 1908, she secretly married stockbroker Albert O. Brown, who died in the 1930s. She made her final Broadway appearance in 1920, after which she underwent a face-lifting operation, which was filmed. She toured the country with the film lecturing on how to stay young and beautiful, and also conducted a radio program in the early '30s.

"Later she devoted herself to

Wall Street. Addicted to girlish hats, high heels and frocks, she was attractive and energetic to the end.

Somebody asked her once how she managed to stay so young in appearance.

"It's leading a normal, full life," she replied. "I take exercise. I've never smoked. I never drink. I eat sensible things—lots of proteins and no fats. I go to bed early during the week, and weekends I entertain on an entertained."

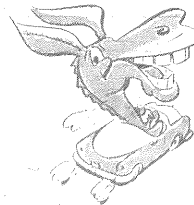
Sidelights

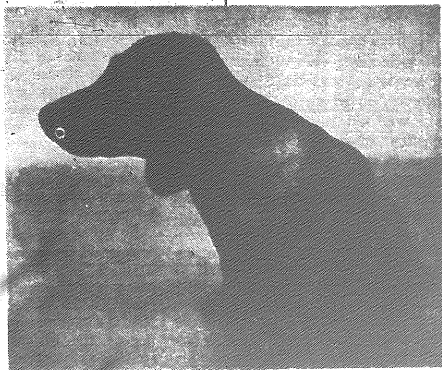

LEXINGTON, Ky. City officials scratched their

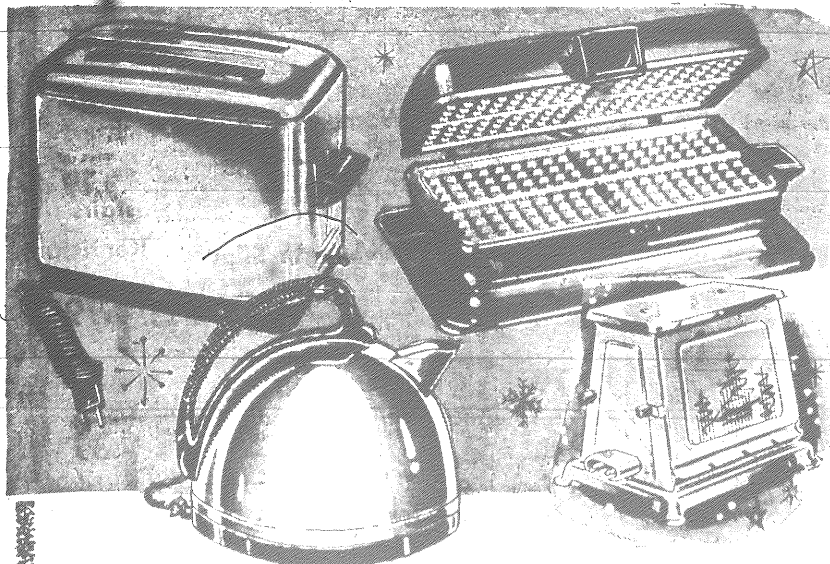
heads when they uncovered a 50-year-old ordinance directing the mayor to authorize repairs "upon the willapup wallapup at a cost not to exceed \$55."

A willapup-wallapup is an outmoded name for a steamroller.

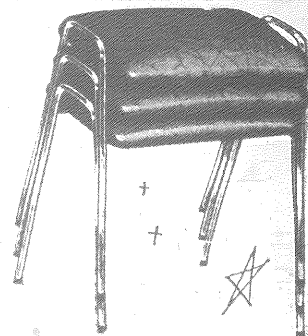

Housing Projects Near Pipelines

Over \$4 million is reported to have been spent on a huge pipe line pumping station and a number of ultra-modern homes just off the Trans-Canada Highway 17 miles west of Ignace. Bright lights from the main street of the "new town" are easily visible from the highway.

Close to ten new homes in the 3000 to 3200 range, have been built along a hill on the east side of the property. The pumping station, offices, and other buildings, are located at the south end.

Similar projects will be built every 40 miles along the pipeline right-of-way, it is reported.

Dryden Population Wager Settled

Dryden—A bet on Dryden's future population made five years ago was settled here peacefully Friday afternoon. But neither better won.

Starting over a cup of coffee December 1, 1953, Allan Shaw of Kenora set a wager of \$5 with Vernon Pronger that on the same day in 1958 Dryden's population would be doubled.

At the same time, Mr. Pronger was quick to point out that when he made the bet with Mr. Shaw, he hoped to profit by saying that Dryden's population would be doubled over the five-year period.

matters, and that a few should not be able to stop such a vote. We can assure you that there are members of the organization who are against liquor outlets but who do not oppose the idea of letting the citizens decide for themselves through a plebiscite.

4. Letter of commendation to the Town of Kenora for their efforts in providing off-street parking on local contracts.
5. Provision for an underpass west of the hospital bridge for access to hospitals without crossing highway.
6. Construction of a boat-unloading ramp at Water Street.
7. Relocation of the proposed Sewage Treatment Plant.
8. Construction of diversion sign to boat-unloading ramp.
9. Elimination of pedestrian hazard at Main and First Street intersection.
10. Development of public park at Rabbit Lake.
11. Reciprocity hunting and fishing licenses between provinces.
12. Financial assistance for industrial development.
13. Financial assistance for tourist publicity.
14. Alternate routing of Trans-Canada Highway through Kenora. More specifically, the adoption of the Lakeshore route.
15. Acquisition of the SS Mother to hospital purposes.

PROTECTION OF 1959

There are several items which should be dealt with or pursued during the coming year, among which are the following:

1. Completion of the Lakeshore routing of the Trans-Canada Highway.
2. Relocation of the proposed sewage treatment plant.
3. Government assistance for tourist and industrial development.
4. Completion of highways north of Minaki.
5. Acquisition of additional property for off-street parking.
6. Development of additional public parks and trailer camps.
7. Greater participation of members in Chamber affairs.

CONCLUSION

In concluding this report of the activities of the Kenora Chamber of Commerce for the 1959 year, we wish to state that although membership participation was very disappointing throughout the year, the Kenora Chamber had accomplished much. However, we feel quite safe in assuming that had our membership participation been greater, we could have accomplished much more. We are only as strong as our members.

Many of us are aware of the shortcomings of our community and many of us have complained bitterly about it, but it seems that we are all doing our complaining in the wrong places at the wrong time. These things, we are sure, will find much more sympathy and understanding at a chamber meeting, and perhaps will receive the necessary attention and action.

As the outgoing president of this organization, I would like to take this opportunity of extending my sincerest thanks to all members who have taken a keen interest in chamber affairs, and a special thanks to my executive and directors and committee members for their support during the past year.

As you will note from the Secretary's report, we will be faced with the task of finding a new secretary very shortly. I would ask that the Kenora Chamber of Commerce consider very strongly the recommendations made in this report.

NEW YORK — The heavy flow of liquor on a Brooklyn pier caused a legal hanger Monday for a British ship steward.

George Jackson, 51, steward on the freighter Sengalese Prince, was fined \$100 for peddling nearly 600 bottles of Scotch from the ship's stores to dock workers.

Jackson told this story: While his ship was in Hong Kong, there was a substantial theft from the liquor stocks. To try to square his account, he decided to sell some of the remaining stock here at above-shipboard prices.

By offering Scotch at two bottles for \$5, he could make a substantial margin above the untaxed shipboard price, but it still was a bargain for American customers.

When customs officers noticed numerous longshoremen carrying bottles under their jackets, they checked up, found the freighter's liquor stores, sealed in port to prevent untaxed sales, had been opened.

Jackson had \$1,200 cash when arrested. He pleaded guilty before United States district Judge Walter Bruchhausen to breaking the seal, and illegally selling untaxed liquor, and was fined \$50 on each count.

He thanked the judge for the light sentence, and for making it possible for him to sail for England with his ship Thursday. "It'll be the best Christmas I've ever had," he said, "to be able to be home."
