Christmas Call Finds Language No Barrier

"Hi Grandpa! With these words in English, the four young children of Mr. and Mrs. Nick Heavel Sunday morning to their grandfather Heavel by long distance phone in Rotterdam, Holland.

Two of the children have never seen their grandparents, and the other two, born in Holland, were babies when they left to make their home in Canada 13 years ago.

"I decided that this year I would talk with my grandpa on either day, but since I left home," said Mr. Heavel, who is advertising manager for the Miner and News, "I tried to get the call placed on Christmas Day or on New Year's Day, but the phone company told me that all the time was booked solid. I had the call placed for 6:30 a.m. yesterday, Kenora time, so that by Dad, who is 79 years old, would receive it at a convenient time."

It was a big day for Mrs. Heavel's parents too. Mr. and Mrs. G. Florym of nearby Hylversum, they journeyed the 20 miles to Rotterdam to be at the phone. At 11:31 Valley Drive, Kenora, the lights were burning at 6:00 a.m. Sunday as the family rose early to be ready for the call. At the zero hour, the long distance operator called to say that the call was ready in 20 minutes. It finally came through at 4:30 a.m., but when connections were made, they were perfect.

"I had forgotten my Dutch, and had to think a little before I could talk with my Dad," said Mr. Heavel. "I told the children they don't understand the language, and my Dad doesn't know English. So all they could say is 'hello grandpa!'"

Mrs. Heavel, who was home four years ago, didn't have the same difficulty talking with her parents. It was an exciting 9 minutes for both families.

With the five recently opened rehabilitation centres in operation, many hundreds of disabled persons are now finding that life can again be meaningful and exciting. SEWAGE PROBLEM SOLUTION MAY BE FOUND IN RESEARCH DEVELOPMENT

Within the past two weeks, the Canadian Pulp and Paper Industries released details of a new sanitary sludge disposal system which holds high hope for smaller communities. It was developed primarily by the Research Branch for the industry, but found suitable for sanitary use also. Six months ago a trial installation was made at a Montreal suburb of 7,000 people, and has functioned reasonably well.

On Dec. 2nd details of the system were released through the press and radio. Quite possibly, Kenora's Council may examine the scheme. Here are the details:

NEW SANITARY SLUDGE DISPOSAL PLAN

Raw sewage solids are settled to the bottom of a primary clarifying tank. The overflow from that tank is chlorinated and sent through the outfall into the river. The solids are pumped into a smaller and similar settling tank building. Here they are concentrated to a sludge of about 10 per cent solids content. This is pumped into a storage tank inside a building. There it goes through a small distilling machine to chop up fibrous material and is sent to the top of the tower (the AST vessel) outside the building. Here the sludge is atomized with pressure nozzles into the empty tower. Its walls are held at a high temperature (1000 deg. F. at the top and 1000 deg. F. at the bottom) by four banks of electric heaters. These are controlled individually and automatically from a panel inside the building.

As the water in the atomized spray flashes into superheated steam under the influence of the heat, the solid particles are blown away. The time they have fallen half-way down the tower. At this point, air is introduced at low pressure from a compressor inside the building. The solid particles combine with the oxygen in the air and are burnt in a dry flow of hot gases. A few leading towards the bottom of the tower is a hopper for the ash. The steam condensed by spraying water will flow into the overflow of the settling tank. This condensate will

Medicine Bottle Recalls Founding Of Johnson's Store

An interesting news item of the finding of a small medicine bottle bearing the name "W. D. Coate, druggist, Rtr Portage", published in the Miner and News, has brought another interesting story to light. This concerns the founding of Johnson's Pharmacy. It happened this way.

Back in 1889 in Omamee, Ontario (about 10 miles from Peterborough), young Joe Johnson read an advertisement in a newspaper asking for applications for a druggist at a town called Keewatin. Young Mr. Johnson was a recent graduate in pharmacy, and decided to quit his job, and head west. He arrived in Keewatin, as agreed with Mr. Coate, and started to work in the Coate pharmacy.

The following year Mr. Coate moved his business to Kenora, being located where the Excel Coach Lines today have their depot. After a year or two Mr. Johnson was made, and Johnson's Pharmacy came into existence. It later moved to where Lindsay's Store is presently located on Second Street.

The firm was still active, Mr. Joe Johnson died in 1941.

PETITION FOR LIQUOR REFERENDUM BEING CIRCULATED IN FORT FRANCES

FORT FRANCES — Petitions are being circulated through Fort Frances by representatives of the Chamber of Commerce and Trades and Labor council to obtain a special election on cocktail bars and lounges.

The referendum is tentatively scheduled for Jan. 27.

The two organizations were informed by the town council at a special meeting Thursday night that there must be 1,112 signatures gained by the petitioners by next Wednesday or the voting for additional liquor outlets will not be held.

The meeting was attended by representatives of the Fort Frances Ministerial association and the "Vote No" committee, who have been insisting that the council has been acting hastily in setting the voting date.

Two members of the Council, J. H. Parker and Cecil Gregory, put their signatures to a by-law that would rescind a recently passed bylaw that calls for the referendum. If the petition has not obtained names of one-quarter of municipal electors by Wednesday, the rescinding by-law will be given second and third reading to stop the referendum.

The special Council meeting was held without knowledge of the press. Reporters contacted Mayor J. T. Livingstone for a statement afterwards. Mayor Livingstone said "I still see nothing wrong with holding a referendum on this question. I think it is a democratic expression of opinion."

**NATURAL GAS SALES
TAKE BIG JUMP**

Sales of natural gas in Canada in October totalled 22.59 billion cubic feet compared with 15.61 billion in the corresponding month a year earlier.

January-October sales are 40 per cent ahead of last year at 221,837,441,000 cubic feet, the bureau of statistics reports. Revenue from October sales was \$12,150,221, up from \$8,316,108.

WON'T COLLECT TAX

The teams that come under the new ruling will not have to collect amusement tax, roughly assessed as 10 per cent of the price of admission.

When a player on an amateur team is paid more than \$30.55 per game the team is compelled to collect and remit the tax to the treasury. However Mr. Allan added if at the end of the season a club can show that the salary average of all the players on the team is less than \$30.55 per game, the amount will be refunded to the club.

He said amateur hockey players are also given the same provision for a two-week practice session—\$30.55 per practice.

Most clubs will be given a reprieve for the current season, Mr. Allan said.

The new rules are being forwarded to all amateur hockey clubs in the province.

Mr. Allan said a study will be made of other sports which claim amateur status.

Amusement tax is assessed under the Ontario Hospital Tax Act.

Bill Huxley, business manager for the Ontario Hockey Association and in Toronto all teams in the OHA Senior A and B series should be exempt from paying the tax. He did not know how large their numbers would be.

Mr. Huxley said the OHA didn't ask the provincial government to reduce the team amusement tax, although it knew the government was considering doing so.

The driver of a truck or other large vehicle should show his ability as a driver by keeping to his own side of the road, and not monopolizing the centre. He will gain a clearer road for himself if he lets the small cars pass when they wish to.

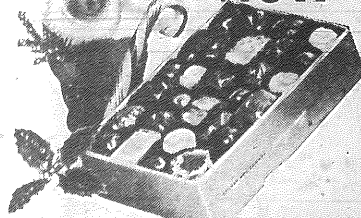

Toronto—Provincial Treasurer Allan redefined the term amateurism and exempted most Ontario hockey teams from paying amusement tax.

The new treasury board ruling says that any hockey player receiving less than \$30.55 per game is considered an amateur player.

Previous ruling was that 40 per cent of the players of a team could not receive a salary of more than \$20 per game and still retain amateur status.

Mr. Allan said the new ruling will exempt most of the teams now considered amateur.

"Our object has been to keep some control but not interfere with struggling clubs trying to get along," he said.

ROYAL COMMISSION ON COAL

1959

In anticipation of forthcoming regional public hearings, the Royal Commission on Coal (1959) invites Organizations and Associations wishing to express views and suggestions to submit briefs.

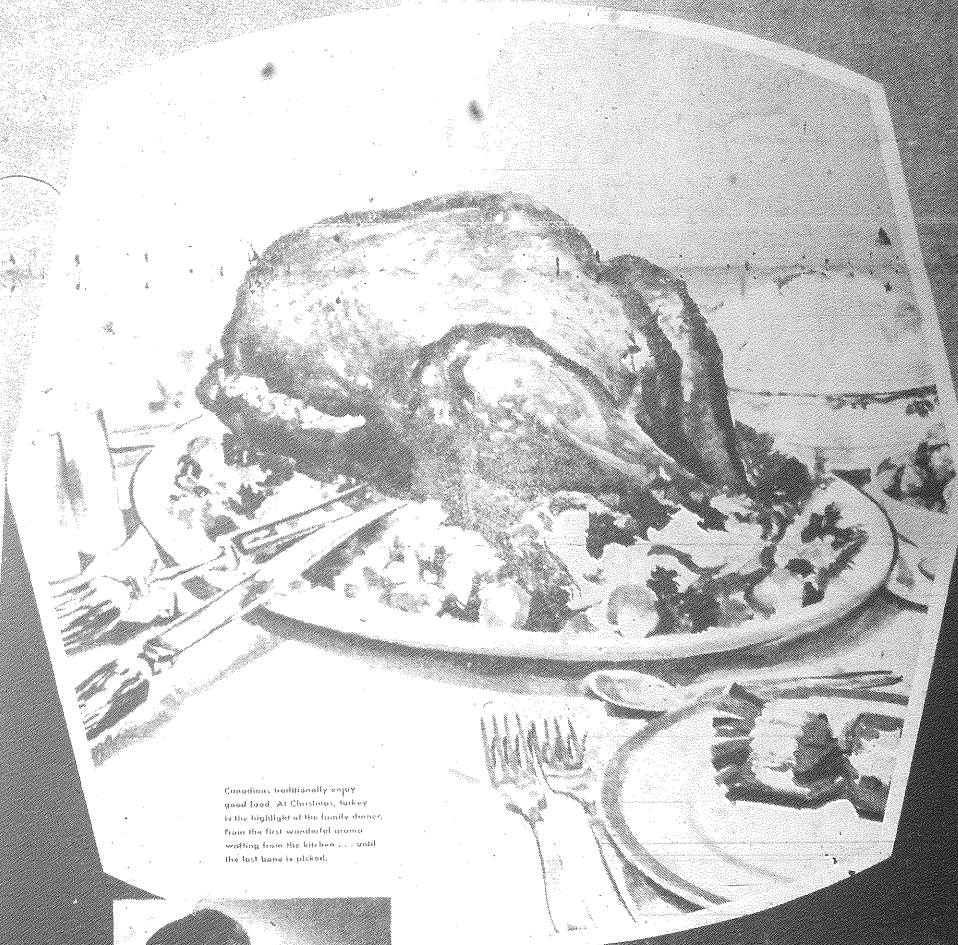
The inquiries of the Royal Commission will extend principally, but not necessarily exclusively, to the examination of the following subject matters outlined in its Terms of Reference, namely:

- (a) the present and future markets for coal as a source of energy and for other purposes in the various regions of Canada;
- (b) the steps that can reasonably be taken to reduce the cost of production of coal in the various coal producing areas of Canada and the costs of its distribution to Canadian markets;
- (c) the steps that the Canadian coal producing industry can take to secure as large a market as possible for Canadian coal and to place and maintain the industry on an economic basis;
- (d) the measures that can reasonably be adopted by governments to support the economic production, distribution and sale of Canadian coal;
- (e) the economic and social consequences of the cessation of mining operations in any one district.

Briefs (in 10 copies) must be submitted in writing and should reach the Secretary of the Royal Commission on Coal (1959), P.O. Box 127, Postal Station "D", Ottawa, Canada, not later than January 25, 1960.

It would be helpful if Organizations and Associations intending to submit briefs could so inform the Secretary of the Commission without delay.

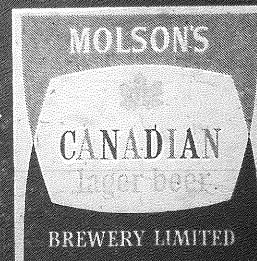

Mrs. Duchnicki will find her husband has established a home at 805 Webster avenue.

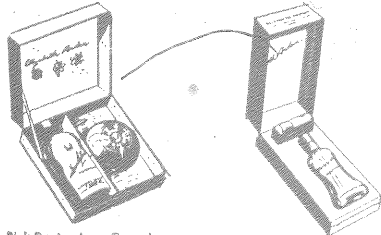
