ICE AND RAIN BLAMED FOR RASH OF ACCIDENTS

icy streets and hazardous driving conditions were blamed for a rash of holiday accidents which claimed a heavy toll of damage to vehicles but fortunately left occupants unharmed. Kenora Police today listed a fairly extensive summary of traffic accidents since Christmas Eve, but damage was under \$100 in most cases.

Mr. L. McKellar of Keewatin, driving a truck west on Highway 17 in Norman, struck a snowbank and the truck clipped off several guard rails, but did not drop down an embankment across from Dugan's Motel.

Bernard Sirtoski of Kenora was south-bound on Rupert Road, making the turn onto 2nd Street N. near the school, when his 1959 Chevrolet station wagon struck a parked truck loaded with pulpwood. Bernard Paquette of Longbow Lake was the operator of the truck, and apparently was stopped to remedy some trouble. Damage to the front portion of the station wagon was given at \$200.

At 2:15 p.m. Christmas Day, Wm. Sawchuk of Keewatin, driving a 1959 Dodge owned by Fred's Taxi, southbound on First Avenue S., swerved to avoid a car driven by Earl Holm. The taxi suffered damage to its underpinnings when it struck a steel post.

The rear portion of a car driven by Donald Lafreniere of 4th Street N. was damaged when struck by a 1953 Mercury driven by Alan Law of Kenora. Mr. Lafreniere apparently had stopped on First Avenue S. to pick up a pedestrian when the following car collided with him.

On Dec. 26th at 11:50 p.m. Clarence Nixdorf of 1150 Street N. was southbound on Melick Avenue in his 1954 Pontiac when he lost control on the icy hill. His vehicle hit a parked 1941 Chevrolet owned by Charles Canfield, Rabbit Lake, and parked car. This was a 1951 Studebaker owned by Matthew Puts of Kenora. The left rear portion of the Studebaker, including the trunk, was damaged. The right side of the Pontiac and the left side of the Chevrolet were also damaged.

Thursday afternoon on Main Street, cars operated by T. A. Saul and the Ontario Provincial Police were involved in an accident. Minor damage resulted to the police cruiser.

Numerous lesser accidents are also listed in the police report book.

Ont. Hydro Awards Contract Valued At \$8.8 Million

Ontario Hydro announced today the award of a contract valued at approximately \$8.8 million for Associated Electrical Industries of Canada Limited for two, 300,000-kilowatt steam-turbine generators to be used in the new Lake-view generating station west of Toronto.

The first two units for this station were ordered in 1957 for service in 1961 and 1962 and the two additional units now being ordered are scheduled to come into operation in 1963 and 1964.

The Commission expressed its satisfaction that a substantial portion of the units would be manufactured in Canada by the Canadian General Electric Company at Peterborough under an arrangement between that company and the Canadian Subsidiary of Associated Electrical Industries in the U.K.

FOUR BUILDINGS LEVELLED BY FIRE AT GARROW'S WHITEDOG SAWMILL

A major Christmas Eve fire completely destroyed four buildings at Joe Garrow's sawmill camp located at Whitedog, some 30 miles north of Minaki. Lost were the store, with its contents of groceries and supplies for the area; the cookhouse, the bunkhouse and the warehouse.
