I couldn't afford it he threatened to have the "condemned" house padlocked and my tenants "kicked out on the street." The pressures brought on us to take water that we can't afford are almost unbelievable in a democracy like ours. The good people of Pine Portage and River St. have waited so long for water that now it is almost in sight some of them are becoming slightly intolerant. For instance some of these so called "unsightly shacks" have been around for 20 years without a complaint until the owners refused to sign for water; now suddenly they are "causing concern". These "abandoned cars" have been here at least four years without a murmur of protest till the water question came up. (The owner of one of these cars is my tenant and he is not getting water - poor man). My "condemned" house sat here for over six months without a single

complaint but now that its in better shape than it ever was it too is "cause for concern". (Continued on Page 6)

Letter To The Editor

November 29, 1961

Dear Sir:

I write this in regard to your report of Monday's Council meeting under the heading - Mayor promises to investigate unsightly shacks etc. The article contained this paragraph. (Leaving the water problem for the time being, the residents turned to another matter which is causing concern. They asked if property owners could erect "shacks" sometimes 2 or 3 on lots where there is already one house, and a house that was condemned in Kenora could be moved out to their area and considered alright.)

I believe the condemned house referred to belongs to myself. I regret that it has caused the residents "concern" and I hope you will grant me this opportunity to set their fears at rest. The house was condemned at its former location, because the foundation had collapsed and the house had no sewer in an area where sewer was available. This house now has a completely new foundation on solid rock and the rest of the house has been rebuilt and can pass any test that the "concerned" people care to give it. Alas it still has no sewer but neither do most of the other houses on this street so I do not apologize for this. I should further like to point out that this house was moved to its present location in the early part of May and no one showed the slightest interest or concern over it until a few days ago when I was approached by a resident who advised me to sign for water if I knew what was "good" for me. When I told him







You may not like it when your minister preaches the truth as it is written in God's Word, but you will soon tire of the spiritual dishwater that he will dispense when he stops preaching God's word as it is and starts trying to doctor it up to suit you. The audacity of puny man suggesting that God, the mighty creator should adapt himself to man - Saying in effect I'll serve you Lord but only on my own terms. Such pitiful bigotry.

St. Paul describes the conditions of today in his writing to Timothy, in the third chapter of second Timothy verses three and four. "For a time will come when they will not listen to wholesome instruction but will

overwhelm themselves with teachers to suit their whims and tickle their fancies, and they will turn from listening to the truth and wander after fictions." And then St. Paul goes on in the next verse and exhorts the preacher, "do not shrink from hardship, do your work as a missionary, and your whole duty as a minister."

There are those who say that the solution to world problems lies in world government, but submit to you the daily events of our magistrate's court as evidence that government and law do not take from the heart of

man the desire to do wrong. May I draw your attention to statements made by two well known men. General Eisenhower, a well known military man was quoted as saying that he did not believe that there would be world peace until the world got back to a Bible believing religion. Perhaps you too were listening to Percy Saltzman interviewing Mr. Gardner one of our veteran Canadian politicians from Saskatchewan on television just a few weeks ago, and heard Mr. Gardner make the statement that he did not feel that there would be world peace until the majority of mankind followed the teachings of Christ. I agree with these two men, and say too that only the love of Christ in human hearts will make possible lasting peace.

If there ever was a time in the history of Mankind when the world needed a powerful church preaching, and practising the message of the love of Christ it is now. So friend, instead of hoping that your minister will slip you a spiritual tranquilizer on Sunday, why not pray that God will inspire him with the same divine enthusiasm that lit up the lives of Luther - Wesley - Moody, and other great men of God, and Sunday at your church can become the highlight of your week. Fellow ministers, let us at St. Paul exhort do our whole duty as a minister, and everyone, let's keep Sunday, the Lord's day free from the things that would distract from the worship of God. Our help in ages past - Our hope for years to come - Our shelter from the stormy blast - And our eternal home.



