## Triple Drowning Accident Near Dryden Last Night

The waters of Ghost Lake, popular resort centre 15 miles north-east of Dryden, last night claimed the lives of three men.

Word of the triple tragedy reached the Dryden detachment of the Provincial Police about 11.30 p.m. when the lone survivor of the 4 man fishing trip, reached town.

Names of the victims have been released by police as follows:

Edward Landry, age 41, married, of Dryden  
Born December 27th, 1921;

Joseph Clement Drapeau, age 38, of Isrial,  
Quebec. Born June 30th, 1924;

George McKay, age 35, married, of Oxdrift.

The surviving member of the quartet is Agrien Landry of Dryden, brother of one of the victims.

The four men set out in a boat on Ghost Lake after an early supper last night, and near the centre of the lake, the boat overturned. No reason for the mishap is given.

All four men managed to cling to the overturned craft, and although there are many camps on the lake, darkness fell before they were seen. One by one the three men lost their grip on the boat, and slipped below the water, except Adrien, who managed to make it to shore.

At dawn today Constables R. W. Millar and G. L. Kilpatrick, equipped with skin diving equipment, commenced their search for the bodies.

The body of Drapeau was recovered about 200 feet from shore and the body of Landry about 200 yards from shore. The body of George McKay has not yet been recovered but Police returned to the scene this afternoon.

### CPR Announces Summer Train Service For Area

Winnipeg — Summer train service to the Lake of the Woods was announced Wednesday by the Canadian Pacific Railway.

Starting June 29, summer service to Kenora will be provided by the Dominion, Train No. 8, with stops at Ingolf, Sherwood Lake and Lacombe on Fridays and Saturdays.

Through July and August, return service from Kenora to Winnipeg will be on the Dominion, Train No. 7, on Monday mornings.

On the Dominion Day Civic holiday and Labor Day weekends, service will be Tuesday morning instead of Monday morning.

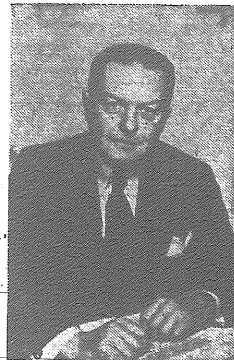
### RETURNING OFFICER HAS 230 POLLS ORGANIZED IN KENORA - RAINY RIVER

W. J. Gray, returning officer for the Kenora - Rainy River riding, doesn't agree with those who complain that the election campaign is too long. The fact that much of the election campaign has been carried on via TV doesn't mean a thing in the Kenora-Rainy River riding, where most of the area is without TV coverage of any kind.

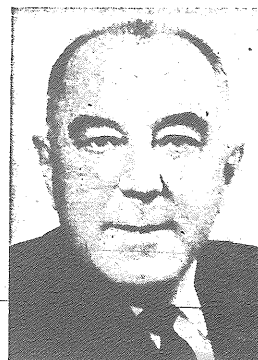
With approximately 2,400 Indian voters, the election could swing one way or the other. Mr. Gray reports that he has integrated the polls as much as possible but there he polls, exclusively Indian. These will be located at Whitefish Bay, Wabigoon, Shoal Lake, Rat Portage, Whitledge Rapids, Grassy Narrows, Lac Seul,

Cat Lake, Pihangikum, Poplar Hill, North Spirit Lake, Deer Lake, Sandy Lake and Sachigo. Even the candidates will have trouble getting into these polls, because of the expense of flying in.

The magnitude of organizing polls in a riding as large and as widely scattered as the Kenora-Rainy River, which is the second largest in the whole of Canada is evidenced by the fact that Mr. Gray has had to locate 230 polling places, and 230 Deputy Returning Officers. One poll was "washed out" not by the heavy rains of the past six weeks, but because Mr. Gray had difficulty in finding a Deputy Returning Officer who could read and write.

### Candidates to Address Public Meeting Here

A public meeting which will bring to the platform Bill Benidickson, Vic Croxford and Paul McRae, Liberal-Labour, Conservative and New Democratic candidates respectively in the June 18th federal election, has been arranged for Saturday evening at 8:30. The auditorium of the High School in Kenora has been secured for the meeting by the sponsors, the Kenora-Keewatin Trades and Labour Council.

While the candidates have debated the issues in their district centres during the past two weeks, it appeared that such a meeting for this community would not take place. Ald. Ed Nerlon will be the Kenora chairman, and speeches of the candidates have been limited to 20 minutes, with a 10 minute rebuttal to follow in the reverse order. The candidates and committee will arrange for the order of the speakers on the platform. "We feel that 90 minutes of discussion will be sufficient time for the candidates to talk and yet short enough to assure the audience that the meeting will

not be too long," said the secretary of the Trades and Labour Council, in announcing the meeting had been arranged.

### Cement Blocks Made Here Slated For Local Buildings

Welcome news was received by a new local industry this week, when the concrete blocks of Ken-Krete Ltd., a comparatively new arrival in Kenora industrial circles, were approved by architects as meeting the exacting tests required by the various codes governing block construction.

It is understood that as a result of the approval received that the local products will be used for two outstanding projects, the new Technical School and the Kenora General Hospital extension. The pressure tests of 1,000 pounds were surpassed by the local concrete blocks tested,

reaching 1350 and 1400 pounds in average.

The new plant is located in the former C.P.R. Roundhouse and the machine, Preschek 1962 is one of the latest models on the market, turning out 900 concrete blocks an hour. The blocks are then placed in a dryer and are conditioned for 28 days. Using a granite mix with the concrete and other materials the new blocks are of fine texture and line, and can be laid down at competitive prices, with the cost of transportation from outside points eliminated.

The new company received the strong support of local organizations in seeking approval for their product, the Kenora-Keewatin District High School Board, Chamber of Commerce, Industrial Board and Town Council in their efforts to secure the official recognition of the products capabilities.

Employing eight men in regular employment the new company will be a welcome addition to local industries and help to the Town's economy.

In selecting the species to be planted on any given acre, care is taken to ensure that tree species suitable to the site are used.

The most important factors to consider are type of soil, moisture conditions and possible competition from hard woods brush and weeds. On sandy dry soils with little competition jackpine and red pine usually grow well, on heavier soils either white or black spruce is preferred. The spruces and white pine are better able to stand some shading than red or jackpine, so if there is much competition they are favoured.

## L & F Department Completes Spring Tree Planting

The Timber Branch of the Department of Lands and Forests reports that this spring 30,300 coniferous tree seedlings were planted on Crown Lands in the Kenora District.

About 51% of the trees were white and black spruce and the rest white, red and jackpine. The weather was favourable for planting throughout the season, the ground was moist at the time of planting and since then more rains have kept even sandy soils

moist for the seedlings to get a good start in growing this coming summer.

Planting was carried out on cutover areas, where natural regeneration of coniferous species has not taken place to a degree considered satisfactory, and on parts of last year's burned areas where fire had destroyed the established regeneration and standing trees.

The above number of trees planted covers approximately 750 acres, which equals in area almost five 160-acre farm lots. This compared to our total timbered land does not sound very impressive, but if all these trees were in one block, it would be a valuable stand of timber especially since they are of our most

**Poison Ivy**

One of the greatest hazards of the summer season is poison ivy. This aggravating, irritating complaint puts hundreds in hospitals every year and thousands more go to at least once to a physician to get relief. If the face or eyes are involved, by all means see a doctor quickly.

Remember, there is no cure for poison ivy, so save your money on so-called "cures". Certainly, there are numerous lotions and ointments that will ease the pain and itching while the infection runs its course.

The best precaution against poison ivy and its close relative poison oak, is to know how to recognize the plants and to avoid them. They are both three-leaved climbing plants. On the ground they are about a foot high, but more often they climb up walls, fences and trees. Sometimes they are mixed with honeysuckle, morning glories and other climbing plants. Another branch of the poison ivy family is poison sumac. It is a small shrub with tiny white berries. The effect of all three is the same - a stinging, itching patch of blisters. Discomfort is acute and if the rash is spread over a considerable portion of the body, it can become quite a serious affair.

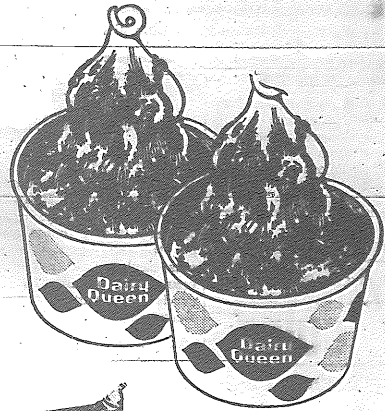

Upon the suggestion of a police physician, she was placed in a state hospital for mental observation.

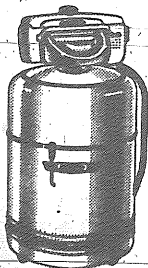

Recalled**

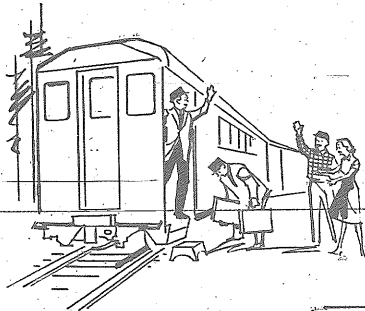
WESTHAMPTON BEACH, N.Y. — The man who piloted the first transatlantic passenger flight got together with his passenger for the first time in 34 years Sunday. And one of the things they discussed was how they just missed beating Charles A. Lindbergh.

"We were ready before Lindbergh but because of weather we didn't go and Lindbergh did," said Charles A. Levine, the passenger in the single-engine Wright-Bellanca monoplane that spanned the Atlantic June 4-8, 1927.

Lindbergh's historic solo hop from New York to Paris was on May 20-21 of that year.

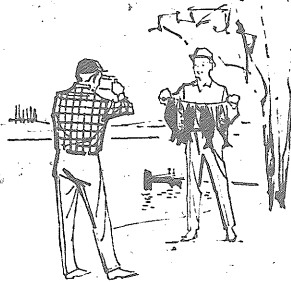
Levine and his pilot, Clarence Dueson Chamberlain, took off from Roosevelt Field, Long Island — the spot Lindbergh started his transatlantic run — and landed in a wheat field at Eisleben, Germany, 3,911 miles and 42 hours and 45 minutes later. That was 300 miles longer than the Lindbergh flight.

Chamberlain, 68, now is in the real estate business in Connecticut and Florida. Levine, 65, lives in New Rochelle, N.Y., where he works for an electronics equipment manufacturing firm.

 "At least half the bride-

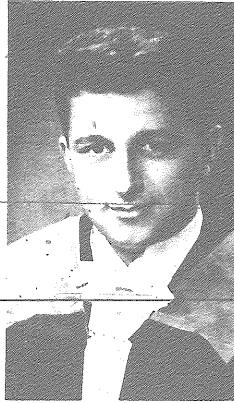
grooms I marry smell like a brewery," the Church of England parson complained in his parish magazine.

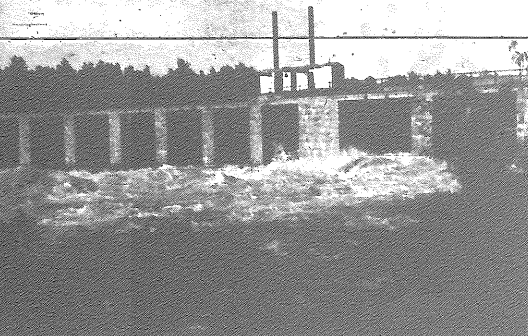
