#### **Deputations/Presentations**

Director of Engineering and Infrastructure, Greg Breen provided Council an update on capital projects.

- Moncrief Construction Sports Centre parking lots are in final stages of pavement. The launch is in, creek work completed and accessible parking will be included.
- First Avenue South roadway is getting repaired and resurfaced. The paving will take place into next week.
- Fifth Street South sidewalk pours were taking place today and will follow gravel maintenance and paving there.
- 9<sup>th</sup> Street North there are some curb entrances near the cemetery and curb lowering near Houghton Road that will be completed.
- Gould/Railway –Gould Road there is a culvert replacement taking place and asphalt will be completed following that. There is no intention to leave the rougher service for the winter, we will cap that with pavement and will be a smooth surface for the winter. The Gould portion will have a surface treatment will be placed for the winter. There is still settlement taking place so we will come back to that in the spring. The new poles are in for the overhead cabling realignment and Synergy North will be running cables. There are a few curb and valve repairs that need to take place and they will complete the second lift of pavement.
- North of the bypass capital graveling program will take place on the Anderson Branch Road from Carlton Road to Riverbend, and also the length of School Road all the way from East Melick Road.
- Playgrounds fencing has come down today at Central Park and over at Norman Park the lower bowl is complete and inspections are lined up for next week. Partial opening for this area next week.
- Marine line floating in Harbourfront and the work installation is scheduled for next week.

# Sustainable Funding to the Northern Ontario School of Medicine (NOSM) University

4. Moved by K. Van Belleghem, Seconded by G. Chaze & Carried:-

Whereas that the City of Kenora recognizes the urgent need for physicians in Northern Ontario as it is experiencing a shortage of trained physicians and specialist physicians; and

Whereas life expectancy of Northern residents is more than two years lower than the Ontario average, and that mental health and addictions are at four times higher rate; and

Whereas one in eight Northern residents does not have access to a family doctor and many must travel long distances to access health-care services representing the failure of health care in in Northern Ontario; and

Whereas communities in Northern Ontario require access to equitable health care, especially underserved rural, Indigenous, and Francophone communities; and

Whereas the Northern Ontario School of Medicine University's current base funding rates have not been increased sufficiently to accommodate growth and expansion;

Therefore Be it Resolved That with the announcement of unprecedented medical expansion for NOSM University's medical programs, the City of Kenora strongly requests that the Provincial government grant NOSM University's request for a permanent increase in annual base funding of \$4.0 million before the end of this fiscal year so it can continue to deliver on the mandate that was originally established by the Conservative Government in response to the needs of Northern municipalities; and further

That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Premier Doug Ford, Minister of Health and Deputy Premier Sylvia Jones, Minister of Colleges and Universities Jill Dunlop, MPPs Greg Rickford, Vic Fedeli, George Pirie, Ross Romano, Kevin Holland, Association of Municipalities of Ontario, Northern Ontario School of Medicine University, Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities, Northern Ontario Academic Medicine Association and the leaders of the opposition parties of Ontario.

I, Councillor Kelsie Van Belleghem, provided Council a Notice of Motion at the September 20, 2023 regular meeting of Council of intent to bring forward the following motion at tonight's October 18, 2023 meeting:

Whereas, in June 2015 the Truth and Reconciliation Commission held its closing event in Ottawa and presented its multi-volume report including 94 "calls to action" to further reconciliation between Canadians and Indigenous Peoples; and

Whereas, on December 16, 2015 the Prime Minister committed to National Indigenous Organizations that he would meet with them annually in order to sustain and advance shared priorities; and

Whereas the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Calls to Action call on all levels of government, including municipal governments, to adopt a number of recommendations in the report; and

Whereas in order to properly meet the goals of the Commission it is imperative that we keep accurate, public records of our progress;

Therefore Be It Resolved that Council requests Administration to draft an annual reporting policy whereby Council will receive an annual staff report outlining the ways in which the City of Kenora has addressed the municipal calls to action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission in the year prior which includes other non-legislated reports; and further

That Council of the City of Kenora calls on both the Provincial and Federal governments to also commit to annual reporting for their progress in adopting the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Calls to Action; and further

That this resolution be forwarded to neighbouring municipalities, the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO), the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM), Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities (FONOM), Association of Municipal Managers, Clerks and Treasurers of Ontario (AMCTO), MP Eric Melillo, and MPP Greg Rickford.
