Call to Order

Deputy Mayor Roussin called the meeting to order.

Community Improvement Project Area and Plan for Keewatin

1. Moved by S. Smith, Seconded by M. Goss & Carried:-

That Council gives three readings to a bylaw to authorize a Community Improvement Project Area and a Community Improvement Plan for Keewatin; and further

That the final draft revised Community Improvement Plan is revised to reflect Section 5.2 "General Program Requirements" (f) after "accordingly, the grant may be reduced on a pro-rated basis", include "... and in no case should the total grant amounts received exceed the eligible cost of the improvements to that property;"; and further

That bylaw number 99-2015 and bylaw number 100-2015 be hereby repealed.

Community Improvement Project Area and Plan for Harbourtown Centre 2. Moved by M. Goss, Seconded by S. Smith & Carried:-

That Council gives three readings to a bylaw to authorize a Community Improvement Project Area and a Community Improvement Plan for the Harbourtown Centre; and further

That Council directs staff to accept suggestions as follows made by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs:

- 1. That the final draft Harbourtown Centre Community Improvement Plan is revised by replacing Section 7.10 "Application Fees", with the paragraph below for enhanced consistency and clarification:
- 7.10 Application and Permit Fees Grant Purpose

The purpose of this incentive program is to waive any associated planning approval and building permit fees for the landowner/developer. Although this incentive is not included under Section 28 of the Planning Act, the waiving of building permit fees is permitted under Section 7 of the Ontario Building Code Act. Description: The City will provide a grant equivalent to the cost of the City's planning application and building permit fees for approved projects in accordance with Section 69 of the Planning Act and the City's Tariff of Fees By-law. Requirements: Any property or business owner who undertakes redevelopment of lands and/or buildings in the CIP project area is eligible for this grant. The owner would be responsible for all mapping and registration costs for agreements and plans where applicable. All grants for planning application fees and building permit fees will be equal to 100% of the application fees paid by the applicant, to a maximum of \$5,000; and further

That the final draft revised Community Improvement Plan is revised to reflect Section 8 "Grant Eligibility Requirements" (f) after "accordingly, the grant may be reduced on a pro-rated basis", include "... and in no case should the total grant amounts received exceed the eligible cost of the improvements to that property;"; and further

That bylaw number 83-2012 be hereby repealed.

Community Improvement Project Area and Plan for Former Mill Site 3. Moved by D. Reynard, Seconded by M. Goss & Carried:-

That Council gives three readings to a bylaw to authorize a Community Improvement Project Area and a Community Improvement Plan for the Former Mill Site; and further

That the final draft revised Community Improvement Plan is revised to reflect Section 4.2 "General Program Requirements" (f) after "accordingly, the grant may be reduced on a pro-rated basis", include "... and in no case should the total grant amounts received exceed the eligible cost of the improvements to that property;" and further

That bylaw number 77-2011 be hereby repealed.

We want to make sure we are utilizing ideas in the CIP but accessing other options such as funding announcements to make sure we are building really good developments in the planning stage and working with them. Karen will follow up with Nadia on how she is working with other municipalities on this.
