Call to Order

Mayor Canfield called the meeting to order and Councillor McMillan delivered a blessing.

Keewatin Non Profit Housing Corporation Disbandment 4. Moved by C. Wasacase, Seconded by R. McMillan & Carried:-

That Council supports the Kenora District Services Board in moving forward with divesting the Keewatin Non Profit Housing Corporation.

Kenora Hydro Corporation Merger with Thunder Bay Hydro 5. Moved by R. McMillan, Seconded by C. Wasacase & Carried:-

Whereas the Corporation of the City of Kenora (the "City") is the sole shareholder of Kenora Hydro Electric Corporation Ltd. ("KH"); and

Whereas the City passed By-law Number 95-99 in respect of KH dated as of October 18, 1999, as amended from time to time (the "Transfer By-law"); and

Whereas KH and Thunder Bay Hydro Electricity Distribution Inc. ("TBH") intend to amalgamate (the "Amalgamation") pursuant to section 174 of the Business Corporations Act (Ontario) (the "OBCA") to form an amalgamated entity ("LDC Mergeco"); and

Whereas in order to facilitate the Amalgamation, Thunder Bay Hydro Corporation ("TB Holdco"), TBH, KH and the City intend to enter into a merger participation agreement (the "Merger Participation Agreement"), substantially in the form of a draft merger participation agreement (the "Draft Merger Participation Agreement") previously presented to the City for review; and

Whereas pursuant to section 2.3 of the Merger Participation Agreement, KH is required to enter into an amalgamation agreement with TBH substantially in the form of the agreement attached as Schedule 2.3 to the Merger Participation Agreement (the "Amalgamation Agreement"); and

Whereas subsection 176(4) of the OBCA provides that an amalgamation agreement is adopted when the shareholders of each amalgamating corporation have approved of the amalgamation by a special resolution of the holders of the shares of each class or series entitled to vote thereon; and

Whereas pursuant to section 185 of the OBCA, a holder of shares of any class or series entitled to vote on the resolution approving an amalgamation may dissent, in which case such shareholder, in addition to any other right the shareholder may have, is entitled to be paid by the corporation the fair value of the shares held by the shareholder subject to compliance with the dissent procedure contained in section 185 of the OBCA; and

Whereas the City declares that it is not exercising such right of dissent in connection with the Amalgamations and waives its right to receive notice of a meeting of shareholders pursuant to subsection 176(2) of the OBCA in connection with the Amalgamation; and

Whereas after the Amalgamation has taken place, LDC Mergeco, TB Holdco and the City intend to enter into a unanimous shareholders' agreement governing the affairs of LDC Mergeco (the "Unanimous Shareholders' Agreement"), substantially in the form of a unanimous shareholders' agreement (the "Draft Unanimous Shareholders' Agreement") previously presented to the City for review; and

Whereas pursuant to the Merger Participation Agreement the City is required to execute a letter agreement confirming LDC Mergeco's right to continue to use all City real property to the same extent and in the same manner as KH is using it (the "Easements Letter") substantially in the form of draft letter agreement attached as Schedule 4.2(g) of the Merger Participation Agreement (the "Draft Easements Letter");

Now Therefore Be It Resolved That:

(a) The City approves the Amalgamation;

(b) The City hereby confirms that the Transfer By-law duly conveyed, assigned, and otherwise transferred all of the assets of The Hydro Electric Commission of the Corporation of the Town of Kenora, including land, building, distribution lines, distribution transformers and meters, substation equipment and other assets of the said business, to KH as of December 31, 1999;

(c) The terms and conditions of the Merger Participation Agreement, the Unanimous Shareholders' Agreement and the transactions contemplated thereby are reasonable and fair to the City;

(d) The City and KH are authorized to enter into the Merger Participation Agreement, substantially in the form of the Draft Merger Participation Agreement;

(e) KH is authorized to enter into the Amalgamation Agreement, substantially in the form set out in Schedule 2.3 to the Merger Participation Agreement;

(f) The City is authorized to enter into the Unanimous Shareholders' Agreement, substantially in the form of the Draft Unanimous Shareholders' Agreement;

(g) The City is authorized to enter into the Easements Letter, substantially in the form of the Draft Easements Letter;

(h) The execution and delivery by the City of the Merger Participation Agreement, the Unanimous Shareholders' Agreement and the Easements Letter and the performance by it of its obligations thereunder, substantially in the form and on the terms set out in the Draft Merger Participation Agreement, the Draft Unanimous Shareholders' Agreement and the Draft Easements Letter, respectively, with such deletions, amendments or additions thereto as the Chief Administrative Officer, or other duly authorized representative, of the City (the "Authorized Representative") may determine, is authorized and approved, the execution of such agreements in accordance with the provisions of the paragraph immediately below being conclusive evidence of such determination;

(i) The Authorized Representative is authorized and directed, for and in the name of and on behalf of the City, to execute and deliver the Merger Participation Agreement, the Unanimous Shareholders' Agreement and the Easements Letter, substantially in the form and on the terms set out in the Draft Merger Participation Agreement, the Draft Unanimous Shareholders' Agreement and the Draft Easements Letter respectively, with such deletions, amendments or additions thereto as the Authorized Representative may in his or her absolute discretion determine, the execution of such agreement in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph being conclusive evidence of such determination; and

(j) The Authorized Representative is authorized and directed, for and in the name of and on behalf of the City, to execute and deliver all such other agreements, amendments, instruments, certificates, resolutions and other documents, including a resolution of the shareholder of KH approving the Amalgamation, and to do all such other acts and things as the Authorized Representative may determine to be necessary or advisable in connection with the Merger Participation Agreement, the Unanimous Shareholders' Agreement and the Easements Letter, or to carry out the intention of the foregoing resolution, the execution and delivery of any such agreement, amendment, instrument, certificate, resolution or other document or the doing of any such other act or thing by the Authorized Representative being conclusive evidence of such determination.
