Call to Order

Mayor Reynard called the meeting to order and Councillor Smith delivered a blessing.

Deputations

Melissa Klippenstein - Proposed Four Plex Location

Ms. Klippenstein lives close to the proposed area to be turned into a ball diamond and parking lot and is opposed to the location for the ball diamonds and parking lot and believes that the space should remain a forested area, a nature park reserve, and left as is. The area of forest is used by many nature enthusiasts, hikers, dog walkers, families, bird watchers, cyclists. It is part of a rabbit lake trail loop and includes 4 already existing hiking trails.

Ms. Klippenstein would like to see a clear description of why administration picked the forested area of Garrow Park/Rabbit Lake trails system for this proposal, and what evidence indicates that this was a better choice than an already cleared and flat and partially developed piece of land. She further requested any reports on the environmental impact to the area for this proposal. She felt the residents of the area should have been notified by the city of this proposal, as it effects our area, instead of finding out about it after the fact, through the newspaper.

John Mash - Proposed Four Plex Development

Mr. Nash provided a letter to Council which was read as part of his deputation in regards to his concerns over the proposed location of the development of a 4-plex baseball facility in the Garrow Park Thomas Aquinas School area. Development of this facility will eliminate a significant portion of a high-value greenspace area within Kenora and portions of an extremely popular urban trail network.

Mr. Nash suggested some sites that may be viable options recognizing the City will have more access to land ownership and feasibility. He suggested a partnership with Mount Evergreen Ski Hill and use Nav Canada tower site on Airport Road across from old Skyline Store Flat Sand Field Requires moving existing tower. Mud Lake Area directly east of Transfer Station (Old mill site).

Marty Laffin - Proposed Four Plex Development

Mr. Laffin lives in the area and noted it is an increasingly busy Birchwood neighbourhood. Developments and improvements in recent years to Garrow Park and the beach, the Rowing Club, the pickleball courts, and the nature trail, while beneficial to the City of Kenora as a whole, have increased traffic and noise in the neighbourhood quite dramatically. Now the Green Space is being threatened. He is also concerned about the irreparable damage done to the environment by the destruction of the green space.

Investing Canada Infrastructure Program-Recreation Stream Application 17. Moved by M. Goss, Seconded by K. Ralko MOTION DEFEATED

That through the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program—Community Culture and Recreation Stream, municipalities may submit a project application and have 73.33 percent of costs covered with a maximum project cap of \$50 million; and further

That Council directs staff to apply for funding under the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program—Community, Culture and Recreation Stream to proceed with the development and construction of a new ball diamond fourplex; and further

That Council hereby authorizes any cost overruns of the project.

Discussion: The intent of relocating the ball diamonds is to move the ball diamonds to one concentrated area and focus on the available lands from that relocation for development of housing. We do not have enough taxation, or enough customers on our water and sewer system to keep costs reasonable. We are short of housing and need to address working with developers to build housing but need attractive suitable lands to do that.

Councillor Van Walleghem felt the better use of the money would be to focus on supporting winter tourism. Community clubs could expand with a roof over the outdoor rinks. Councillor Van Walleghem requested a recorded vote for motion #17.

Councillor McMillan referenced that it is not often that \$0.73 cent dollar funding is available for municipalities, especially for recreation. He remains excited about the fourplex project and the benefits are exciting for the community. Councillor McMillan visited the site and it has caused him to step back and take a second look and after viewing the site and reviewing the information shared with respect to cost and what it will do to the property area. The recommendation is specific to funding, however, the application for funding would have to have a site attached to it. Staff have reviewed many different sites and this was the recommendation. Councillor McMillan continues to support the fourplex but not the specific location being proposed.

Councillor Smith noted that we are having a housing shortage and desirable housing is first and foremost. The 73 cent dollars are a wonderful opportunity in our community and that never comes along. Councillor Smith conducted two site visits to green space on Garrow and had a good look at it. There is a mixture of hard woods and soft wood on typical Canadian Shield and a \$2M price tag for blowing that up. Councillor Smith is protective of green space in her neighbourhood and the value of green space has paid off immensely in that area. There is a better site out there.

Mayor Reynard noted that all of Council's election priority during the election was housing as their number one priority. We need to look at items that create synergies throughout our community and focus on the overall big picture, and not the 'not in my back yard' concerns. Every proposal that we to try and move forward on pertaining to housing or otherwise, the community has met with opposition. This fourplex complex originally came forward because someone wanted the A & W area for a development but there was no money available at the time to proceed with the development. This area was identified as the best site for a fourplex at that time. At some point you have to stand up and really believe in housing and move this community forward or we will not solve the housing shortage.

Councillor Van Walleghem requested a recorded vote. The Clerk asked each member to declare their vote.

She feels her reference in the report in regards to a confidential source on Facebook's 'Rant and Rave' page completely discredited her and her report. We need to stand up for the good work we are doing in our community around the social issues and homelessness.
