D. Deputations/Presentations

Jim Bruzzese of BMA – Water & Wastewater Long Range Financial Plan

The Water and Wastewater Long Range Financial Plan was presented to Council. O.Reg 453/07 requires municipal water utilities to develop a comprehensive long range financial plan. The City of Kenora has taken a proactive approach and has included the wastewater system as well. The goal is to ensure the City's water and wastewater operations are financially sound and services can provided on a sustainable basis.

Discussion:

Councillor Poirier expressed concern over continued rate increases for water and sewer. He would like to see the City explore debt financing for projects rather than increasing rates.

Debra LeMaistre & Kelly Williams of Rotary Club of Kenora – Peace Park Proposal

Rotary Club of Kenora is requesting Council's support for the construction of a Peace Park on municipal lands. The desired green space is between the former Blue Heron and the former laundromat. Features of the Peace Park will include a peace pole and flower beds. Images of peace poles from around the world were shared. The design for Kenora's peace pole has not been finalized.

An additional feature to the Peace Park will be a monument for missing and murdered Indigenous women. Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls, Transgender and Two Spirit Persons (MMIWGT2S+) in partnership with Rotary Club of Kenora have selected the Peace Park as the ideal location for the monument. Meggie Cywink of MMIWGT2S+ shared that in March she was in the Kenora area to meet and discuss the project with families, to help bring more attention to the issue. The monument will be a place for residents and visitors to gather, and will be cared for by community families.

Discussion:

Council shared their excitement for the project and the partnership between Rotary Club of Kenora and MMIWGT2S+. The partnership will have tremendous impact on the community, neighboring communities and visitors.

Susan Evenden - Anicinabe Park - The Winter Gateway to Kenora Proposal

Anicinabe Park operators, David Longe & Susan Evenden would like to request that Old Chalet Lane remain closed to through traffic for the winter of 2020/2021, with the intention

September 8, 2020 Committee of the Whole Meeting Minutes of expanding the recreational opportunites at Anicinabe Park to include winter activities for the people of Kenora and families from neighbouring communities looking for a new winter tourism experience. The outdoor activities will be free for all, along with the operation of a Chalet Service with foods and beverages for guests. Currently, much of the snow machine traffic bypasses Kenora and spend their leisure dollars in Falcon Lake. Anicinabe Park is the perfect gateway to Kenora for those who are already travelling on Lake of the Woods and as a staging location for those who want to explore Lake of the Woods. By working together with our tourist partners, the park can offer places to eat, sleep and shop, with any of the number of unique Kenora businesses. With the help of partnerships with Kenora Hospitality Alliance and the City of Kenora, Anicinabe Park will promote outside of our community, a venue that will welcome visitors to Kenora as a 4 season destination. The park is preparing to have ready for the winter of 2020-2021 and beyond, several exciting initiatives, all complimented by an indoor warming space & washrooms.

Crokicurl rinks at Anicinabe Park were greeted with enthusiasm last winter. This was made possible with support from the Kenora Hospitality Alliance. Crokicurl is one of the fastest growing new sports, with rinks springing up in Cities all across Canada. Armed with experience and user feedback, there is opportunity to promote and build on the local tournament held last year, to encourage Crokicurl fans from other communities. Over the past year, the inside of the park store has been renovated, creating a café/bar. With further renovations in the works, the Anicinabe Park licensed café will be ready to provide winter visitors with a light food menu, coffee, hot chocolate and adult beverages. In a world focused on social distancing, limiting large gatherings indoors, it is more important than ever to provide people with outdoor adventures, that they can enjoy safely.

Discussion:

Mayor Reynard thanked Susan for her presentation. Councillor Smith shared she is a huge advocate for neighborhood trails and asked if there is opportunity for summer walking trails. Susan shared the park has a different atmosphere in the summer. There is a small trail along the shoreline however, to define a trail it comes with expenses. The park is willing to explore all opportunities. Council shared appreciation for the work being done to develop new winter tourism.

Wayne Beckworth – Old Chalet Lane Closure Proposal

Wayne presented to Council in opposition of the proposed Old Chalet Lane closure. He has canvassed the homes in the area and has received 14 signatures in opposition of the road closure. He feels the park's activities can be accomplished without the closure of the road. As a 33 year resident of Old Chalet Lane, traffic safety has never been a concern. There is concern the quality of snowplowing will decline with the road closure and school buses would not be able to turn around properly. Wayne supports the winter activities that Anicinabe Park is hoping to create however, he feels this can be done without the closure of the road.

Discussion:

Council thanked Wayne for his deputation. Mayor Reynard requested that the documents referenced in his presentation be provided to the City Clerk.

Dan Carter – Canadian Hemp Farmers Alliance

The Canadian Hemp Farmers Alliance mission is to tackle the United Nations sustainable development goals by developing sustainable, functional hemp based products that help reduce the need for fracking for fossil fuels, mining, as well deforestation. The Canadian Hemp Farmers Alliance is looking to raise \$3 million to conduct research and development

September 8, 2020 Committee of the Whole Meeting Minutes for processing and formulating of hemp flower, seeds, grain, grain oil, protein, stalk fibres to make functional hemp based products such as bio plastics, pulp and paper, liquid fuels, solid energy pellets, batteries, auto mobile parts, building materials, textile fabrics and soil remediation materials.

The Canadian Federal, Provincial & Municipal governments can open procurement opportunities for their own various government departments who will be the purchasers of the sustainable, functional hemp based products from the formulation facility who will be the sellers. Ways that the Government Departments can encourage hemp agriculture growth is by purchasing hemp products like:

1) Hemp Toilet Paper, Photo copying paper, tissue, paper towels

2) Hemp Bio Plastic Cutlery, Plates, Bowls, Straws, Table Cloths,

3) Hemp Fibre Uniforms

4) Hemp Fibre for insulation for new building development projects

5) Hemp Super Capacitor Batteries for all Government + Public auto mobiles that are electrically powered

By having the Canadian Federal, Provincial & Municipal Governments adopting functional hemp based materials into their sustainable development plans this will help to reduce the global market need for things like fracking for fossil fuels, mining for coal as well deforestation. This will encourage other Corporations to adopt functional hemp based products into their Sustainable Development strategies, as well this will encourage agricultural growth and give the (Formulators + Processors + Farmers) the ability to work out a healthy profit sharing contract which allows for farmer + processing + formulation expansion at the same rate which will create over a Million Jobs in the process to tackle the United Nations 2030 Sustainable Development Goals.

New Job opportunities that would be created by the municipality would be jobs for government, research and developers, processors, formulators, agriculture, marketing and business owners within different demographics such as women, youth & Indigenous.

Dan is asking Council to join the Canadian Hemp Farmers Alliance Government Membership.
