2021 NOMA Conference Minister's Questions

Council discussed potential issues to pose to the Ministers during the bear pit session at the upcoming NOMA conference. There have been three presented for Council consideration.

Downloading of the cost sharing of the NWHU by the province is significant to the municipality as we will be facing over \$300,000 impact to our budget to pay for the NWHU and this will be on the backs of the taxpayers. Now is not the time to download more onto the taxpayers and public health is not a municipal responsibility.

Perhaps resolutions at KDMA should have included the NWHU levy as it has huge impacts on municipal budgets. KDMA chose to put forward other resolutions rather than this one, the modernization of public health would be top of mind because all of our municipalities will be financially impacted by this change. Need to be selective on the questions to put through for Minister responses.

Council suggested that we send all our questions to Minister Rickford, the Premier and the appropriate Minister regardless if they are asked during the NOMA conference.

Discussion: We have been working with a very outdated Beaches, Parks and Trails plan and this gives us an opportunity to develop a current recreational master plan which will incorporate all aspects of our recreation.

Discussion: The former brand wasn't given the proper funding to develop and grow it. We need to commit MAT tax dollars to assure there are proper funds allocated to develop this brand.

NOHFC Funding Application – Kenora Recreation Centre Enhancements 14. Moved by R. McMillan, Seconded by S. Smith & Carried:-

That Council hereby directs staff to complete an application to the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Community Enhancement Stream related to planned upgrades at the Kenora Recreation Centre grounds and green space in the 2021 Capital Plan in the amount of \$800,000; and further

That Council hereby approves any cost overruns associated with the project.

Discussion: Until such time as Phase 1 has been submitted and acknowledged so any costs until that time would be deemed ineligible so until we receive that notice from NOHFC we will not be able to move forward with these projects.

Kenora Economic Recovery Plan 2021 Implementation

Whereas the COVID-19 global pandemic has had a devastating effect on the City of Kenora business community; and

Now Therefore Be It Resolved That Council reaffirms the waiving of fees for the purpose of the establishment of Outdoor Commercial Patios as established in DS-6-2 Outdoor Commercial Patios, subject to staff application approval; and further

That Council approves free metered parking in the Harbourtown Centre for July 2021 excluding municipal parking lots; and further

That Council approves amendments to rental fees for the Whitecap Pavilion to support public events; and further

That Council approves amendments to allow for free evening and weekend parking at the Park Street municipal parking lot; and further

That in accordance with Notice By-law Number 144-2007, public notice is hereby given that Council intends to give three readings to a new Tariff of Fees and Charges By-Law at its April 20, 2021 meeting to give effect to these rates outlined in the revised Schedule "E".

Discussion: There is a \$45,000 additional impact to the budget as a result of these approvals. These are also the proposed fees going forward so will be a long term impact on revenues for the Whitecap.

We need to look closely at what we rent the Pavillion out for. This asset is meant to contribute to a vibrant Harbourfront and therefore we need to look closely at how we want this venue used. We should not be supporting events that closes down the Harbourfront as it is meant to be access to the water at all times. As we move forward talking about redevelopment of the Harbourfront we should keep this in mind.

The following was highlighted by Council:

- 1. Councillor Goss is concerned with the ongoing challenges with finding housing in Kenora. Overall the challenges continue with people needing housing. Council has made changes to make properties available. We are on the cusp of a housing crisis and we need to put pressure on the government to make housing available.
- 2. Councillor Smith stressed again all the safety measures with related to the pandemic. It is being questioned why we are shut down and people need to recognize it isn't about numbers anymore. It is about capacity in the hospitals and health care workers are going to make difficult decisions on who lives or dies. When we look at our hospital capacity across our catchment area, there are only 11 beds ICU. The situation is dire right across the province and we are no better off than other health units.
- **3.** Councillor Poirier publicly stated that the interprovincial borders have been shut down by the province and not the Council of the City of Kenora. We have to follow what the province puts in place and the OPP are monitoring it.
- **4.** Councillor Ralko noted that today is her second consecutive lockdown birthday.
- **5.** Councillor McMillan acknowledged Earth Day and some of the things the City is doing regarding environmental efforts in our community.

6. Mayor Reynard reminded people in the community to be patient and kind to others. There are people who live and work here and provide important services to our community that are permitted to be here. Please be respectful of others. We are all in this together.
