Discussion: Acting Detachment Commander Jim Neild provided the April 2022 statistical report. The number of calls for service were 1,483. There was a slight decrease in assaults from the previous year. Property crime the break and enters are continuing to be high. Theft under continue to be from unlocked property including cars and garages, sheds. The mischiefs were up and you can tie the theft under with the mischiefs. Working with the businesses on how they can reduce the thefts in their business. Street crime unit is working hard to address the dangerous drugs that are in the community. Continue to increase the foot patrol hours and April had 187 hours. In April there were 9 impaired charges and they continue to grow. They are doing ride checks every day to ensure the message is getting out there. In the month of April they did 37 rides. There were 53 mental health contacts in April and the mental health crisis team addressed these to work to divert from the hospital where possible.
