1. Call to Order

Chad called the meeting to order at 4:03 p.m. and delivered the land acknowledgement.

2. Declaration of Pecuniary Interest and the General Nature Thereof

There were none declared.

3. Confirmation of Minutes

Moved by Mary Bawden, seconded by Heather Bird & Carried:

That the Minutes of the Accessibility Advisory Committee meeting held April 18, 2024 be confirmed as written and filed.

4. Capital Projects Review

• Dock Upgrades Project

Norman Park - Shaun shared that a new dock will be installed at Norman Park. The ramp from the shore to the floating dock will be sixteen (16) feet to help lessen pitch. The standard is twelve (12) feet. The shore deck will be level with the ground. For the time being it will be grass up to the shore deck. There is hope that funding will become available in the future to allow for the expansion of the accessible pathway to the dock.

Discussion:

The committee recommended that a railing be installed on the shore deck and ramp.

Rotary Peace Park – The Coney Island walking bridge is going to be repurposed during the summer months and placed at the Rotary Peace Park. The docks will allow for events such as water ceremonies to take place and increase park usage. There will be no boat docking or swimming permitted. The docks are to be used as a quite spot to allow people to get close to the water.

Discussion:

The group shared that it would be nice to include seating on the docks as well as a garbage can in the park.

Moncrief Construction Sports Centre – A new dock will be installed at the new boat launch at the Moncrief Construction Sports Centre. The docks will be eight (8) feet wide.

Discussion: Wood borders on docks to stop wheelchairs were recommended. It was also suggested that couple of benches be installed.

• Moncrief Construction Sports Centre Lobby Reconfiguration Project

Shaun shared renderings for the Moncrief Construction Sports Centre Lobby Reconfiguration Project. The placement of the front desk will be relocated, there will be a multi-purpose room where the current cafe is and in the location of the old desk a seating area will be installed. To access the pool and fitness area, new glass automated sliding doors will be installed.

5. National AccessAbility Week – May 26th to June 1st, 2024

Plans continue for National AccessAbility Week. Emails went out to all schools within the city for the What Does Accessibility Mean to You School Challenge. The City of Kenora Communications Clerk has also been working on the social media campaign that will run from May 26th to June 1st. Departmental social media campaigns will also be run on the Library, Museum, Tourism Kenora and Moncrief Construction Sports Centre's social media pages.

6. Roundtable

Chad shared with the group that he was informed that May 16th is Global Accessibility Awareness Day.

Peggy provided an update on the railings she had advocated for. All three businesses/organizations are going to fix their railings. Graspable railings will be installed. Greg shared that the railing on the new ramp at Keewatin Beach will be graspable. Graspable railings are now code. The committee thanked Peggy for her great advocacy.

Heather shared that she sent a message to Susan Evenden regarding the Multi-Use Trails Letter. Susan Evenden and Peter Kirby would like to come to attend a meeting.

Greg spoke to the ramp that was requested for the rocking ship at Norman Park. The committee discussed placing a ramp to a playground fixture that is not accessible. There are ranges of abilities with children and although the ramp may not make the fixture fully accessible it does make it more inclusive.

Wishlist:

- Doorknobs to levers particularly at City Hall
- A wheelchair accessible taxi
- Accessible Pool and adult change bed in change rooms at pool

• Keewatin beach should become more accessible for people in wheelchairs. Mobi-Mat is often dirty and does not go out far enough

• The sidewalks that have slanted driveway access need to be changed; people in wheelchairs and motorized wheelchairs have a tendency flip over on the side when crossing the driveway

• The accessibility washrooms in Kenora or not accessibility friendly need to revisit this (not big enough for chairs, ex. Pavilion)


• All businesses should have accessibility especially in the downtown core including the store themselves

• Discussions around the curb stops and ramps around new builds such as the KDSB property for seniors in Lakeside not being adequate


• Lower toilets in public washrooms and add grab bars on both sides, most power chairs are 22-24 inches, stalls need to accommodate


- Reduce slope of ramp at McLeod Park


Front service area alterations







Dock Program

Norman Park








Rotary Peace Park
