#### A. PRESENTATION – Northwestern Health Unit Representatives

Jennifer McKibbon, Health Promoter for the Northwestern Health Unit presented Council with the mail in cards for the Kenora area (1,800 in total from the Kenora, Keewatin, Redditt, Minaki, Longbow, Keejick and a few other Post Office locations).

She indicated that the expected return had been 8% and the area response for returns of the cards was 20% with Kenora slightly above that with 20.9% rate of return. Jennifer suggested that the rate of return was significantly high enough for Council to consider passing a Smoke Free By-Law. Jennifer indicated that 38% of the Ontario population voted in the municipal elections.

Jennifer indicated that a Smoke Free By-Law is a municipal by-law and would have to be policed by the municipality, although the Northwestern Health Unit would offer any assistance they could.

Jennifer advised that Ottawa-Carleton have passed a 100% No Smoking By-Law.

Jennifer advised that this is an individual Health Unit Project and not a province wide initiative at this time, but it is a public health prerogative and issue.

Jennifer indicated that Michael Perley from OCAT would be coming to the area at the end of March and setting up appointments to meet with the local Chamber representatives.

Mayor Canfield thanked Jennifer for her presentation and said Council will take this information under advisement.
