DISPOSITION

DISPOSITION

1. Amendment to By-law No. 126-2002 – Fire Control RECOMMENDATION:

That Council of the City of Kenora amend Section 2- General Provisions, of By-Law Number 126-2002 as follows:

2.4 No person shall set a fire for outside burning of any kind whatsoever in the City of Kenora during the controlled or uncontrolled burning season in a domestic incinerator unless the parcel of property wherein the domestic incinerator is installed thereupon is one hectare or greater in seize and further, the incinerator and the location of the device must comply with the provisions as set out in Schedule "A" of the Fire Control By-Law Number 126-2002, Burning Rules 15 through to 19.

2. Amendment to "Amalgamated Running Assignment" RECOMMENDATION:

That the Council of the City of Kenora approve the amendment to the "Amalgamated Running Assignment" as follows:

- District 3 amended boundary: The area in the former Town of Jaffray Melick that is located to the north and east of the former Town of Kenora, with an approximate southern boundary that includes part of Railway Street, the Homestake Road (west of the Transmitter Road), the Airport Road and all roads off of it, up to and including the Kenora Airport.
- District 4 amended boundary: The area in the former Town of Jaffray Melick that is located to the south and east of the former Town of Kenora, with an approximate northern boundary that includes the Transmitter Road (east of Sunset Bay), Gould Road (between Sweeny Road and Transmitter Road), the Homestake Road (east of Transmitter Road), and includes the Jones Road and all roads off of it up to and including the Kenora Airport.
