#### Call to Order

Mayor Canfield called the meeting to order and Councillor Poirier read the Prayer.

#### **Confirmation of Minutes**

1.Moved by I. Parkes, Seconded by L. Compton & Carried:-

THAT the Minutes of the last Regular Meeting of Council of the City of Kenora held **Monday, January 26, 2004** be confirmed as written and circulated.

# **Declaration of Pecuniary Interest**

Mayor Canfield then asked if any Member of Council had any Declarations of Interest with respect to any items on the Agenda. There were none.

#### Presentation:

Mayor Canfield made a presentation to Frank Graham in recognition of his 65<sup>th</sup> Birthday that took place on February 4. Mayor Canfield congratulated Frank by presenting him with a City Hat and Sweatshirt and thanked him for all his hard work keeping the streets clean.

#### **DEPUTATIONS:**

#### Wayne Ficek

Mr. Ficek attended the meeting to personally acknowledge and thank the City of Kenora, Members of Council, Members of the Committee and City Staff for their dedicated work, commitment and support over the last several months in working towards, and finally completing the City of Kenora Accessibility Plan that is before Council tonight for formal approval.

#### Don Kinger

Mr. Kinger spoke to the 2001 By-law on the matter of the cross-town corridor and expressed concern on the high cost of a permit for snow machines to come into Kenora. He explained the detrimental affect this by-law is having on businesses/lodges that depend on the snow machine traffic during the winter. Mr. Kinger encouraged Council to repeal the by-law to allow snow machines to come into town, noting this would not be a negative decision from the Club's point of view as snow machine enthusiasts will still ride the trails.

#### Marc Bissonnette

As a business and property taxpayer in Kenora, Mr. Bissonnette expressed concern on the 36% increase in levy by the Health Unit for 2004. Mr. Bissonnette stated the CEO of the Health Unit should be reprimanded for going

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over budget and should not be allowed to go back to the taxpayer when this occurs, referencing the expense to implement the non-smoking ban across the City. Mr. Bissonnette suggested the City determine who the CEO is accountable to for his budget and his actions, and that Council not give in to paying this levy.

• Bayridge Road

From the junction of Bayridge, Glen Cameron and Golf Course Road, westerly for 750 m.

- Glen Cameron Drive
- From the junction of Bayridge,

Glen Cameron and Golf Course Road, southerly for 500 m

• Anderson Branch Road

300 meters from the junction of Anderson Road and Redditt Road, westerly for 1.5 km

# Amendments to Traffic By-law #127-2001 13.Moved by A. Poirier, Seconded by L. Compton & Carried:-

THAT Council give three readings to a by-law to authorize the following amendments to the City of Kenora Traffic Regulation By-law 127-2001:

- add a Stop sign at Kirkpatrick and Peter Avenue;
- remove existing Stop sign at Beggs Road and add a Stop sign at Coker Rd;
- reduce Speed on Coker Road to 60 kph;
- add Stop signs at the following intersections: Loranger Road at Beggs Road, Paquette Road at Beggs Road;
- add a Three-Way Stop at Gunne Crescent/Poirier Drive intersection;
- reduce speed on Gunne Crescent to 40 km/hr.;
- designate Gunne Crescent as a Community Safety Zone.

# **Declaration of Surplus Land – Coney Island** 14.Moved by C. Wasacase, Seconded by T. Szajewski & Carried:-

THAT Council hereby declares Lots 54, 55, 60 and 61, together with that part of road allowance adjacent to said lots on Coney Island on Plan M.13 as surplus municipal property to the needs of the City of Kenora; and

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THAT a Deeming By-law be adopted by the City that consolidates the abovenoted lots; and further

THAT the necessary arrangements be made to sell the land to Catherine Radcliffe based on fair market value in the amount of \$15,000.00, plus all associated costs (survey, appraisal, legal, transfer, advertising) as an addition to the existing lot.
