Minutes

of a Meeting of the Council of the City of Kenora held Monday, March 22, 2004 – City Chambers 5:00 p.m.

WITH Mayor D. Canfield in the Chair, Councillor L. Compton, Councillor R. McMillan, Councillor I. Parkes, Councillor A. Poirier, Councillor T. Szajewski, Councillor C. Wasacase, Bill Preisentanz, CAO, Joanne L. McMillin, City Clerk.

Call to Order

Mayor Canfield called the meeting to order and Councillor Szajewski read the Prayer.

CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

1.Moved by L. Compton, Seconded by R. McMillan & Carried:-

THAT the Minutes of the last Regular Meeting of Council of the City of Kenora held **Monday, February 23, 2004** be confirmed as written and circulated.

DECLARATIONS OF PECUNIARY INTEREST

Mayor Canfield then asked if any Member of Council had any Declarations of Pecuniary Interest with respect to any items on the Agenda.

Councillor Compton made a Declaration of Pecuniary Interest with respect to a property matter reviewed by Committee of the Whole during its Closed Session on March 16. Due to his being a Real Estate Agent and having a property listed that is associated to this item, he advised he vacated the Council Chambers while this item was discussed by Committee.

DEPUTATIONS:

<u> Don Canfield – Laurenson Lake</u>

Mr. Canfield, on behalf of residents of Laurenson Lake presented a Petition to Council opposing the City's proposed plan to dump storm sewer water into the lake as a result of the Highway 17 East development.

The Petition cites the following reasons why dumping should not take place: many residents live on the small lake and it should not be further compromised; some residents have septic fields; there is a great deal of runoff from the highway that contains salt, oil, gas and other contaminants and the lake cannot endure any additional collection for drainage; residents take drinking water from the lake and use wells as their source of water; residents swim a great deal in the lake; and the dumping of storm sewer water will have a devastating effect given its small size and limited inflow and outflow.

Margaret Parkes advised she has been waiting for a response to her letter of March 10 to Mayor and Council that set out a number of inquiries and concerns pertaining to this matter, and questioned when she could expect a response to her letter?

Mayor Canfield explained there will be an Open House held in the next short while on this matter at which time her answers will most likely be addressed.

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David Schwartz also advised he had been researching Environmental Protection documents very thoroughly and the affects of urban run-off. He mentioned he had e-mailed this information to Members of Council earlier.

<u>Art Peters – Hidden Trail Road</u>

Mr. Peters expressed concerns on the Hidden Trail Road that goes directly through his property and advised this matter has gone to the Ontario Municipal Board, although he is displeased with a number of issues. His concerns centre on safety; speeding; environmental; ditching; water run-off; lack of road signs; snow removal; and questioned what is holding the hill in place? He mentioned there have been problems with this road over the last number of years and it was his understanding if this development had gone through as a subdivision rather than a severance these issues would not exist.

Mayor Canfield advised Mr. Peters the City would look into these issues.

Gerretsen, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, the Association of Municipalities of Ontario, the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation, the Association of Municipal Managers, Clerks & Treasurers of Ontario, and the Hon. Howard Hampton, MPP, for support of these most needed enhancements.
