Call to Order

Mayor Canfield called the meeting to order and Councillor Szajewski read the Prayer.

Confirmation of Minutes

1. Moved by L. Compton, Seconded by A. Poirier & Carried:-

THAT the Minutes of the last Regular Meeting of the Council of the City of Kenora held **Monday**, **June 7**, **2004** be confirmed as written and circulated.

Declarations of Pecuniary Interest

Mayor Canfield then asked if any Member of Council had any Declarations of Pecuniary Interest with respect to any items on the Agenda. There were none declared.

PRESENTATION:

Arlene Nelson-Litt

Mayor Canfield made a special presentation to Arlene Nelson-Litt recognizing her as Kenora's "Senior of the Year." Mayor Canfield presented Arlene with a framed Certificate as well as a City Hat and Sweatshirt.

DEPUTATIONS:

Mari Curtis-Poirier

Ms Curtis-Poirier attended as the current Chairperson of the Kenora Public Library Board. She gave an update on various Board activities and thanked Members of Council for their continued support of the Board, including approval of their 2004 budget requirements. In closing, Ms Curtis-Poirier acknowledged the wisdom, expertise and competence of the Library's CEO and staff.

<u>John Moore</u>

Mr. Moore referred to a handout that was circulated earlier, and on behalf of the Kenora Health Providers Group addressed Council on the Group's services available to the citizens of Kenora, ranging from health care and social services, to education and recreation. The Group is hoping Council will see their work as complementary to the Municipal Strategic Planning. Mr. Moore reviewed the information package with Council which included a "snapshot" of health; a list of organizations currently participating in the Group; a "Vision Tree" illustrating how to achieve a healthier Kenora; and the Group's progress to-date. The Group is looking for a response from the City and requested their efforts and priorities concerning this matter be incorporated into the City's Strategic Plan.

Whereas The City of Kenora (the "City") and Minestic Shopping Centres Limited (the "Owner) have entered into a Development Agreement to do certain works at the former Public Works site on Highway 17 East including the cost-sharing of storm water management improvements; and

Whereas the Owner will be constructing its portion of the storm water pipe prior to the City constructing the storm water pond and associated pipe; and

Whereas the City Engineer recommends that it would be in the best interest for the Owner to construct 96.8 m of 1200 mm LDS pipe and 47 m of 900 mm LDS pipe along Miikana Way on behalf of the City at an upset limit cost of \$145,000 plus GST;

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the City enter into an agreement with the Owner for the supply and installation of 96.8 m of 1200 mm LDS pipe and 47 m of 900 mm LDS pipe at an upset limit of \$145,000 plus GST; and further

THAT the Mayor and Clerk be authorized to sign an appropriate Agreement on behalf of the City to undertake these works.
