THAT for the purpose of improving the accuracy and currency of the municipal voters' lists and the Ontario Population Reports, the City of Kenora requests the Province of Ontario to make available to the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) on a regular and on-going basis, records of all births and deaths in the province of Ontario as recorded in the Vital Statistics database maintained by the Ministry of Consumer and Business Services; and

THAT the Municipal Elections Act that currently requires the Preliminary List of Electors to be delivered on July 31 of an election year, be amended to permit a delivery date closer to election day; and further

THAT this resolution be forwarded to the Hon. D. McGuinty, Premier of Ontario, the Hon. Jim Watson, Minister of Consumer and Business Services, the Hon. J. Gerretsen, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, the Association of Municipalities of Ontario, the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation, the Association of Municipal Managers, Clerks & Treasurers of Ontario, and the Hon. Howard Hampton, MPP, for support of these most needed enhancements.
