# 6. Resolution of Support-Unincorporated Representation Northwestern Health Unit RECOMMENDATION:

WHEREAS the Northwestern Health Unit has a Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS the Northwestern Health Unit is mandated to provide services to all the residents and ratepayers of the Districts of Kenora and Rainy River; and

WHEREAS the Unincorporated residents and ratepayers contribute, through the taxes collected by the Province of Ontario's Provincial Land Tax system for local services, a total of \$1.064 million annually; and

WHEREAS the Unincorporated residents and ratepayers do not have a representative on the Northwestern Health Unit's Board; and

WHEREAS the Northwestern Health Unit's Board of Directors has five (5) empty seats for Provincial appointees; and

WHEREAS the municipality of the Corporation of the City of Kenora agrees with the "Say for Pay" principle for representation;

THEREFORE be it resolved that the municipality of the Corporation of the City of Kenora encourages the Minister of Health and Long Term Care to appoint the representatives that the District of Kenora Unincorporated Areas Ratepayers Association has nominated to the Board of Directors of the Northwestern Health Unit; and

BE it further resolved that the Minister of Health and Long Term Care make these appointments immediately to enable the residents and ratepayers of the Unincorporated areas to have the representation they have been missing since the inception of the Northwestern Health Unit.

## 3. Adopt-A-Park Program

HOLD

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THAT the Council of the City of Kenora approve the fee increase for the early dismissal days at the after school program at "Evergreen Kids Club" from \$7.00/day to \$10.00/day, effective September 1, 2004; and further

THAT notice be hereby given in accordance with Notice Bylaw No. 14-2003 to increase the after school fees for early dismissal days from \$7.00 to \$10.00.

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THAT the Council of the City of Kenora approve the fee increase for the daily rates for the Castle of Learning & Discovery Children's Centre from \$27.00/day to \$28/day for preschool children and for the increase in toddler daily rate from \$30.00/day to \$31.00/day effective September 1, 2004; and further

## 7. Parking during Harbourfront Events RECOMMENDATION:

- 1. That Council of the City of Kenora approve the use of the Parkade for free public parking during the 2004 Harbourfest and KBI events respectively;
  - a) Friday, July 30<sup>th</sup> , 6:00 p.m. to Monday, August 02<sup>nd</sup> 12:00 Noon
