Call to Order

Mayor Canfield called the meeting to order and Councillor Wasacase read the Prayer.

Mayor Canfield then read the following public information notices as per By-law Number 14-2003-

Confirmation of Minutes

1. Moved by I. Parkes, Seconded by L. Compton & Carried:-

THAT the Minutes of the last Regular Meeting of the Council of the City of Kenora held **Monday, April 11, 2005** be confirmed as written and circulated.

Declarations of Pecuniary Interest

Mayor Canfield then asked if any Member of Council had any Declarations of Pecuniary Interest with respect to any items on the Agenda. Councillor Compton advised he made a Declaration of Pecuniary Interest during the Committee of the Whole In-Camera Session held April 19 and left the Council Chambers while the item concerning a Code of Ethics issue by his son was discussed. Councillor Compton also expressed a Declaration of Pecuniary Interest regarding Motion Number 21 on tonight's agenda as he is a Member of the KMTS Commission.

DEPUTATIONS:

Pearl Bannister

Mrs. Bannister expressed concern on the continued use of the Silver Lake Landfill Site on Jones Road and referred to an earlier petition she submitted regarding this matter. She indicated the petition that was submitted had some 2,200 names on it, and as it represents over 10% of the population she stated the citizens have a right to vote on the issue.Mrs. Bannister is concerned with the dumping of ash, animal carcass, etc., noting the City



plans to continue to dump at this site. Mrs. Bannister advised her Petition can be made available again if it is no longer on file. In closing she urged Council to think about the detrimental effects this dumping will have on the environment and particularly, this site.

Coffee Break Policy

8. Moved by L. Compton, Seconded by R. McMillan & Carried:-

THAT Council of the City of Kenora hereby approves Human Resources Coffee Breaks Policy #HR – 2-16; and further

Kenora Rowing Club's Summer Regattas

- 1. A variance for the boat motor size on Rabbit Lake, set by Jaffray Melick By-Law No. 833, passed 17 November 1981.
- 2. Permission to place course lanes in the water 2 3 days prior to the event & to remove in the following week.
- 3. Exclusive use of the Rabbit Lake/Garrow Park Tennis Courts on Saturday August 27th for the afternoon and evening for an awards and BBQ area, with proper park permit.

Kenora Parkade - Free Summer Parking

10. Moved by T. Szajewski, Seconded by R. McMillan & Carried:-

THAT Council of the City of Kenora approve the use of the Parkade for free public parking on the weekends for the period June 1 to September 15, 2005 in order to accommodate the onset of traffic during the summer months; and

THAT Buck's Brigade be authorized to patrol and provide security and cleanup services at the Parkade during this period; and further

THAT the following steps be implemented to address issues relating to the use of the Parkade for the purpose of the free weekend parking:-

- a) That free parking at the Parkade be restricted to the first two floors and the third floor (and any on the second floor) be signed and retained for the exclusive use of the Market Square tenants in accordance with the contractual obligations.
- b) That there be adequate notice to the Parkade users of one month's notice in advance of the free public use of the Parkade during the summer months
- c) That there be scheduled patrols of the Parkade during free public use
- d) That there be a wash-down of the Parkade following free public use.



Summer Students - Castle of Learning

11. Moved by T. Szajewski, Seconded by L. Compton & Carried:-

THAT Council of the City of Kenora hereby approves two summer students for the Castle of Learning and Discovery Centre for the months of July and August 2005 in support of the summer camp program; and further

THAT the Manager of Community Services be authorized to fill the respective positions and to establish the employment terms of reference in consultation with the Human Resources Manager according to Municipal Hiring Practices and Regulations.

Ukrainian Monument at Harbourfront

12. Moved by T. Szajewski, Seconded by I. Parkes & Carried:-

THAT the Ukrainian Women's League be allowed to erect a monument at the agreed upon location, on the Harbourfront, to commemorate the Century of Ukrainian Settlement of Canada; and

THAT all expenses, including purchase and installation of the monument and foundation will be the responsibility of the Ukrainian Women's League; and further

THAT prior to installation an agreement between the City and the Ukrainian Women's League will be completed to address ownership of maintenance, vandalism and possible re-location.

Policy to Conduct Business on Sidewalks

THAT the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kenora hereby approves a policy for the business owners of the Harbourtown Centre to conduct business on city sidewalks with certain conditions and requirements.

Lease Agreement with Houseboat Adventures

THAT Council give three readings to a by-law to authorize the entering into of a lease agreement with Jeff Gordon c.o.b. Houseboat Adventures for use of the south end of the Main Street Dock for the 2005 boating season.

Kenora Trappers' Council - Nuisance Beavers

THAT the Agreement appended to the April 14 report of R. Perchuk between the Kenora Trapper's Council and the City of Kenora, respecting nuisance beaver services for the period May 16 to September 15, 2005, inclusive, be accepted.

Rippling Water Development

THAT the City of Kenora hereby authorizes the issue of a Certificate of Release of the Maintenance Guarantee with respect to the Rippling Water Subdivision; and

THAT the City of Kenora accepts and assumes Riverbend Lane, Islandview Lane and Lost Lanes into the City's road inventory, as per the recommendation of the Operations Manager; and further

THAT Council give three readings to a by-law for this purpose.



Deeming By-law - Paquette

17. Moved by C. Wasacase, Seconded by R. McMillan & Carried:-

THAT Council give three readings to a by-law to deem all the land within Lots 41, 42 and 43, on Registered Plan of Subdivision M.63, in the City of Kenora, formerly the Town of Kenora, in the District of Kenora not to be lands described in accordance with a registered plan of subdivision for the purposes of Section 50(4) of the Planning Act, RSO 1990; and further

THAT the Mayor and Clerk be and are hereby authorized to execute any and all documents required to complete this transaction.

Private Roads Agreement (Lougheed)

THAT the City of Kenora enters into a private roads agreement William and Charlotte Lougheed, as a condition of approval of application for consent no. B06/04; and further

THAT Council give three readings to a by-law authorizing the Mayor and Clerk to execute the agreement on behalf of the City of Kenora.

Surplus of Property - Villeneuve Road

19. Moved by C. Wasacase, Seconded by T. Szajewski & Carried:-

THAT the Council of the City of Kenora hereby declares the municipal property abutting property described as Part 2 on Plan 23R-5362 as surplus to the needs of the municipality; and

THAT in accordance with Notice By-law #14-2003, arrangements be made to advertise the sale of the subject lands for a three-week period; and further

THAT once the advertising process has been completed, Council give three readings to a by-law to authorize the sale of land to Mark Delorme and Hilary Jackson as a lot addition (consolidation), at the market value of \$1,000.00, plus applicable taxes, as established by Century 21 – Reynard Real Estate, plus survey and all other associated costs.

Kenora Hydro Demand Note

20. Moved by L. Compton, Seconded by I. Parkes & Carried:-

WHEREAS the City was required to incorporate Kenora Hydro into a separate legal entity as a result of Hydro Deregulation; and

WHEREAS the City did incorporate Kenora Hydro effective 1 January 2000 into the Kenora Hydro Electric Corporation Ltd.; and

WHEREAS Kenora Hydro did incur a significant debt back to the City of Kenora in the process of the incorporation in the form of a demand note payable to the City in order to reflect the current value of Kenora Hydro; and

WHEREAS the City does not intend to call the Kenora Hydro demand note during the 2004 calendar year; and

WHEREAS Kenora Hydro's auditors, BDO Dunwoody, require confirmation that this demand note will not be called during the 2005 calendar year in order to properly reflect this amount in Kenora Hydro's financial statements;

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved that BDO Dunwoody be advised that the City of Kenora has no intent to call the current Kenora Hydro demand note; and further



THAT the City confirms with BDO Dunwoody that it shall not call the Kenora Hydro demand note on any date prior to 1 January 2006.

KMTS Commission Compensation

21. Moved by R. McMillan, Seconded by I. Parkes & Carried:-

THAT Council of the City of Kenora hereby authorizes the following level of compensation to Kenora Telephone Commission Members, excluding staff members, as follows:-

1. \$2,040.00 per annum;

THAT a per diem allowance be authorized for Kenora Telephone Commission Members, excluding staff members, at a rate of \$125.00 per day; and further

THAT Resolution Number 26 dated September 11, 2000 is hereby rescinded.
