Of a Meeting of the Council of the City of Kenora Monday, June 13, 2005 – City Council Chambers 5:00 p.m.

Call to Order

Mayor Canfield called the meeting to order and Councillor Compton read the Prayer.

Public Information NOTICES as per By-law Number 14-2003

Mayor Canfield then read the following notices:-

KDSB - Service Delivery Review
