Call to Order

Mayor Canfield called the meeting to order and Councillor Poirier read the Prayer.

Confirmation of Minutes

1. Moved by R. McMillan, Seconded by T. Szajewski & Carried:-

THAT the Minutes of the last Regular Meeting of the Council of the City of Kenora held **Monday**, **September 25**, **2006** be confirmed as written and circulated.

Public Information NOTICES as per By-law Number 14-2003 Mayor Canfield then read the following notices:-

As required under Notice By-law No. 14-2003, Council hereby advises the public of its intention to adopt the following by-laws at tonight's meeting:-

• To amend Schedule "B" Tariff of Fees By-Law No. 100-2003 to implement revised Baseball Rates.

Declarations of Pecuniary Interest

Mayor Canfield then asked if any Member of Council had any Declarations of Pecuniary Interest with respect to any items on the Agenda. There were none declared.

DEPUTATIONS:

<u>Bob McMillin- Congratulations to Volunteers for August Holiday;</u> <u>Telephones-New Councillors; Miikana Way Intersection</u>

Bob McMillin extended a Thank You to all the volunteers that made Harbourfest a great weekend. He also extended a Thank You to Buck's Team for cleaning up so quickly in preparation for the next event.

Mr. McMillin requested that the Councillors' cell phone numbers be listed in the phone book as he has received many calls over the years for his "namesake" Councillor.

Mr. McMillin advised that cars cannot turn off the East Highway when heading east onto Pine Portage Road (left hand turn) due to the meridian on the road. He requested the intersection at Miikana Way be reconfigured in such as way as to accommodate a safe left hand turn onto Pine Portage Road. Mr. McMillin provided Council with a photo of the area he was referring to.

<u>Emily Tacknyk-Roulston – Road, Invoice, Surface Treatment-Unorganized Issue</u>



Emily Tacknyk-Roulston asked about the work that was to have been done on the turn off of East Melick Road to Essex Road and the fact that this was supposed to be hard surfaced and was started but was never finished.

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Ms. Tacknyk-Roulston advised that she was told the reason the Beauty Bay Road was done was because it was curvy and twisty. Ms. Tacknyk-Roulston advised that all roads in this area are twisty, curvy, hilly and rocky and questioned why the Essex Road was not completed.

Ms. Tacknyk-Roulston mentioned an article from June 30, 2006 regarding assessments being frozen and that Minister Greg Sorbara may not have given authority to freeze assessments. She requested that Council jog their memories.

Ms. Tacknyk-Roulston mentioned that the highway should be 4 laned and that the Province has lots of money and this would bring work to the area.

Ms. Tacknyk-Roulston advised Council that she has made a lot of deputations over the years and has never encroached on Council's time - it has always been through deputations.

Ms. Tacknyk-Roulston thanked Rick Perchuk for sending her a letter and a copy of the invoice she had requested.

Dan Essery- Children's Charter

Dan Essery advised that the Kenora Children's Coalition is comprised of a group of interested citizens, parents and organizations. The Children's Charter was presented to the Mayor with the hope that it will be adopted for use in Kenora and that a Council member will be appointed from the new Council as Children's Advocate.

<u>Don Kinger – Garbage Fees (on behalf of Salvation Army)</u>

Don Kinger requested that Council provide some leniency to the Salvation Army for Garbage Fees which are in the neighbourhood of \$1,200 to \$1,500. This is due to the fact that people are dropping off totally unusable furniture and large appliances such as fridges that Salvation Army has to dispose of. Mr. Kinger presented photos to Council.
