Call to Order

Mayor Compton called the meeting to order and Councillor McMillan read the Prayer.

Confirmation of Minutes

1. Moved by C. Drinkwalter, Seconded by D. McCann & Carried:-

THAT the Minutes of the last Regular Meeting of the Council of the City of Kenora held **Monday**, **July 16**, **2007** be confirmed as written and circulated.

Public Information NOTICES as per By-law Number 14-2003 Mayor Compton then read the following notices:-

As required under Notice By-law No. 14-2003, Council hereby advises the public of its intention to adopt the following by-laws at tonight's meeting:-

- 1. An amendment to the 2007 Capital Budget to authorize reallocation of funds from the City's server replacement program for implementation of a virtualized server environment with centralized storage area networks, including a reduction of the related budget allocation from \$97,000 to \$79,775;
- 2. To redirect capital funds remaining from Coney Boardwalk Capital Project for washroom repairs at Coney Beach;
- 3. To increase Daily Rate Fees for the Castle of Learning & Discovery Children's Centre effective September 1, 2007;
 - 4. To redirect capital funds remaining from purchase of Park's mower to capital purchase of Ice Re-surfacer;
- 5. An Amendment to Tariff of Fees By-Law #100-2003 Schedule "B" Recreation Rates effective September 1, 2007;
- 6. To amend By-law #127-2002 Transit Service Agreement Schedule "G" to amend Bus Pass Rates;

7. To amend the 2007 Capital Budget to authorize an appropriation from the Downloaded Solid Waste Reserve for the purchase of software for the Solid Waste Transfer Station Scale program.

Declarations of Pecuniary Interest

Mayor Compton then asked if any Member of Council had any Declarations of Pecuniary Interest with respect to any items on the Agenda. There were none declared.



DEPUTATIONS:

Dennis Wallace

Mr. Wallace advised Council that it is his pleasure to bring forward the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City and the Lake of the Woods Development Commission for adoption this evening, and gave an explanation as to the role of the Commission and briefly the Committees that have been established. He further outlined the work these Committees are presently carrying out and he touched on the project highlights, particularly Downtown Revitalization, and various cultural aspects. In closing he reiterated he is pleased with the progress to-date and will be back to Council to discuss other matters of mutual interest such as the HR function and the reporting mechanism.

Patrick Brett

Mr. Brett advised Council that as a Member of the Kenora Police Services Board, he is here this evening to speak to his concerns around the ongoing police costing process, and requested Council to entertain a resolution that was adopted by the Kenora Police Services Board on August 10. The resolution requests Council to allow the following to attend future Steering Committee meetings of the Police Review Committee as stakeholder representatives in a non-voting capacity: the Chair and at least one other Member of the KPS Board, the Chief of Police or designate, the OPP D/Commander or designate, a Member of the Kenora Police Association and a Member of the Ontario Provincial Police Association. In closing Mr. Brett advised a formal copy of the Board's resolution will be forwarded to Council, and he filed his deputation with the Clerk for the public record.

Colin Wasacase

Colin Wasacase, Chair of the Kenora Police Services Board thanked Council for allowing the Police representatives to attend tonight to present these deputations, citing that the three policing services in the area have always collaborated within the community. He also thanked Mayor Compton for his suggestion for a meeting with the CAO for discussions between the City and the Police.

Chief Jorgensen

Chief Jorgensen spoke to the oversight in limiting various stakeholders in the police costing process to communicating through deputations which has deprived all concerned the opportunity to engage in open, honest dialogue from the start of the process. Chief Jorgensen requested Council to heed the request of the Kenora Police Services Board and to adopt the resolution of the Board that was read by Mr. Brett in order that all stakeholders are involved with the dialogue and assured that the process is unbiased.

Chief Jorgensen filed his deputation with the Clerk for the public record.

Endorsation of Resolution – Owen Sound

6. Moved by A. Poirier, Seconded by D. McCann & Carried:-

THAT Council of the City of Kenora hereby supports and endorses the following resolution from the Council of the City of Owen Sound:-

"WHEREAS Consolidated Court costs have put huge demands on local host municipal Police Services to provide security and pay 100% of the costs; and

WHEREAS the Consolidated Court is used by the entire surrounding community and even by those further a field with its local municipal taxpayers responsible for paying for security; and

WHEREAS a Consolidated Court could be used for a 'change of venue' trial from outside their jurisdiction which would require the local municipal taxpayer



responsible to pay for security; and

WHEREAS the Province of Ontario is the only Canadian Province or Territory not paying for Court Security;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Provincial Government be requested to fulfill its responsibility and pay for 100% of Court Security costs" and further

THAT a copy of Kenora's supporting resolution be forwarded to the Premier of Ontario, Howard Hampton, M.P.P. and the City of Owen Sound."

Funding Agreement – "Anti-Violence Intervention Strategy" 7. Moved by A. Poirier, Seconded by C. Van Walleghem & Carried:-

THAT the Council of the City of Kenora hereby authorizes the Kenora Police Services Board to enter into an agreement with Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Ontario as represented by the Minister of Community Safety and Correctional Services for funding in the amount of \$155,000.00 to enable a project to implement an "Anti Violence Intervention Strategy" in the City of Kenora; and

THAT Council authorizes the Chair of the Kenora Police Services Board to sign said agreement on behalf of the Board; and further

THAT Council authorizes the Chief of Police in conjunction with the Finance Department to administer said funds.

Loan Agreement – Kenora Health Care Centre
