Councillor McCann asked how to proceed if a councilor receives a complaint. The process is to contact the CAO who will then forward the complaint to the appropriate police force.

Mayor Compton asked if the Chief Building Official can also perform by-law enforcement duties. Mr. Preisentanz indicated that currently, the Roads Supervisor is performing the tidy yard by-law enforcement with success but that the CBO can also action items.

There was discussion with respect to ensuring that departments are enforcing by-laws; most enforcement issues come forward as a complaint. If the complaint is not followed up then Council and the CAO generally are contacted by the complainant.

The Mayor commented that, in some cases, it is understandable that a neighbour will not complain about an untidy yard and that all municipal staff should be encouraged to report yards which are eyesores because of debris, garbage etc. to their supervisor for action. He said that it is important that the City, as a whole, looks well cared for. The CAO reminded those present that complainant names are never divulged.

The CAO also commented that it will be helpful to have either police force help with an investigation of a possible zoning infraction. In addition, the fee structure for existing by-laws is being reviewed.

2) Snowmobile Trail System

Bill Preisentanz referred to his report and explained that he took all of the current information and consolidated it, as well as contacting several other municipalities. Terrace Bay, as an example, has a 1 km long trail which, the local snowmobile club maintains but does not require an OFSC permit on. This is in order to allow sleds into town to gas up etc. The advantage is that the club maintains the 1 km trail as part of their system. Kenora has a much larger trail system through town. The CAO cautioned Council that if the OFSC trail was removed, there would be many trespass issues as snowmobilers try to make their way through the City.

Councillor McMillan would like to see a costing associated with the

advantages/disadvantages of the snowmobile club vs city vs no maintenance of trails. Bill Preisentanz indicated that, as far as liability insurance is concerned, the Sunset Trail Riders currently provide the first \$5 million for liability, however this would be removed and the issues would be dealt with under the City's umbrella.

Councillor McCann asked what the status of the 19th Ave. corridor would be. Mr. Preisentanz indicated that the Sunset Trail Riders may be considering diverting the trail through the "Bell's Ranch" property. Further discussion ensued.

Councillor McMillan suggested that a committee be struck to analyze the issue, with a short time frame for a report and recommendation. Both Councillors McCann and Cuthbert expressed an interest in sitting on such a committee.

Bill Preisentanz reminded Council of the success of the partnership between the City, the Sunset Trail Riders and the residents in the Highway 17 East area and stated again that removal of the corridor will mean that there will be trespass issues.

Mayor Compton suggested that the matter be discussed further at the Council meeting on Monday March 26th.

will have less impact on the area, as a whole, than the current zone. Discussion ensued
with respect to the Ministry of Transportation control area. The Kenora Planning Advisory

8) NWORDA Report and Recommendation

Bill Preisentanz presented his report and indicated that while the NWORDA report captures many of the economic issues and pressures currently facing communities in Northwestern Ontario, it appears to jump too readily to the conclusion that a new organizational structure will be the solution to the problem. The report also fails to identify the present "policy vacuum" that exists at the senior levels of government with respect to the economic health of northern communities. These governments need to be held accountable in terms of the development of policy development and the creation of a plan for the future growth, development and prosperity of the north. He further indicated that unfortunately, this report falls far short in the regard. However, it is a good start, and the combined efforts of the municipalities that comprise NOMA should continuing working on all fronts to press the senior levels of government for change.

RECOMMENDATION:

Whereas NOMA at its AGM in April 2006 unanimously agreed to strike a Regional Recovery Program (RRP) Committee to develop a plan to chart a course for economic recovery for the Northwestern Ontario Region; and

Whereas the complex decisions affecting the Northwest are best understood and made by those who live here and by speaking with one voice; and

Whereas the Report "Forging the Future ... an economic vision for Northwestern Ontario" dated January 2007, authored by the NOMA led RRP Committee, identified critical issues facing the municipalities in Northwestern Ontario, and;

Whereas NOMA must continue to press the senior levels of government for the tools to effectively address economic crisis faced by northern communities, and;

Whereas NOMA is now requesting municipal support in principle for the Report and the concept of the creation of NWORDA;

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the City of Kenora acknowledges the issues identified in the Report, and the ongoing efforts of the RPP to develop a pan-Northern growth and development plan and associated policy changes by senior levels of government that in turn support the implementation of the plan, recognizing that there still needs to be recognition and inclusion of strategic First Nation partnerships in an economic vision of Northwestern Ontario development; and

That the creation of a new organizational body from Northwestern Ontario to act as one voice in addressing the economic issues of the region deflects from the underlying reality that the present level of senior governments have created the present 'policy vacuum' and need to be pressured into creation of a plan for the future growth, development and prosperity of the North Now; and

That the City of Kenora <u>not</u> support the concept of the creation of NWORDA; and further

That NOMA and the municipalities within the NOMA District be advised of the City of Kenora position.
