## 3. Proclamation – October as "Child Abuse & Neglect Prevention Month" ...... RECOMMENDATION:

THAT the Mayor be and is hereby authorized to proclaim the month of October, 2008 as "Child Abuse Prevention Month" in and for the City of Kenora.

THAT Council hereby approves amending its 2008 capital budget to increase the 2008 municipal paving budget allocation by \$463,040 to a total of \$1,088,040, with funding to be provided through the Municipal Road and Bridge Infrastructure Investment Grant; and

THAT Council hereby gives three readings to a By-law to amend the capital budget for this purpose; and further

THAT in accordance with Notice By-law Number 144-2007, public notice is hereby given that Council intends to amend its 2008 Municipal Five Year Capital Plan by by-law at its September 15<sup>th</sup> meeting.

## 5. Town of Milton Resolution – Aluminum Cans & Plastic Containers ...... RECOMMENDATION:

WHEREAS Aluminum Cans and Plastic Drink Containers create significant litter on our Roadways and whereas the deposit/return system for alcoholic beverages has proved an effective deterrent to roadside littering; and

WHEREAS many of these Plastic Drink Containers contain water obtained by commercial operations with little or no positive benefit for local residents, and whereas large-scale water taking may adversely affect local water resources, and whereas commercial water tanker trucks create uncompensated wear to local roads; and

WHEREAS a deposit may encourage residents to use personal reusable containers reducing the demand for plastic bottled water;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Council of the City of Kenora endorses the Town of Milton's resolution requesting that the Minister of the Environment consider placing a deposit/return system on aluminum and plastic drink containers; and further

THAT this resolution be forwarded to the Association of Municipalities of Ontario for information and support.

## 6. City of Owen Sound Resolution – Police Sales Tax Exemptions ...... RECOMMENDATION:

WHEREAS police services in Ontario are faced with on-going financial pressures to be able to provide reasonable levels of service to keep Ontario communities safe, and

WHEREAS local property taxes are the main source of funding for municipal and regional police services budgets, and

WHEREAS police services are faced with significant costs in paying for necessary specialty equipment, vehicles and buildings that are unique to ensure a safe Ontario, and

WHEREAS the Federal Government has shown leadership in exempting municipalities from having to pay GST in recognition of one level of government taxing another;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Government of Ontario provide a full exemption of provincial sales tax on goods and services for Ontario police services similar to the GST exemption.

# 7. City of Owen Sound Resolution – PST Tax Exemptions RECOMMENDATION:

WHEREAS municipalities in Ontario are faced with on-going financial pressures in order to provide reasonable levels of service in Ontario communities, and

WHEREAS local property taxes are the main source of funding for municipal budgets, and

WHEREAS the Federal Government has shown leadership in exempting municipalities from having to pay GST in recognition of one level of government taxing another,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED THAT the Council of The Corporation of the City of Owen Sound hereby requests that the Government of Ontario provide a full exemption of provincial sales tax on goods and services to all Ontario municipalities similar to the GST exemption, and further

THAT this resolution be forwarded to Premier Dalton McGuinty; The Honourable Dwight Duncan, Provincial Minister of Finance; the Association of Municipalities of Ontario; and Howard Hampton, M.P.P. seeking support for municipalities being exempt from provincial sales tax on goods and services.

# 1. Reduced Load Restriction – By-Law Number 125-2008

## RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council hereby repeals By-Law Number 125-2008, being a By-Law to Designate the date on which a Reduced Load Period shall start or end and the Highways or Portions thereof to which the Designation applies, in order that a new Clause #3 may be added as follows:-

 " THAT contractors working for residents who reside in the permanent load restricted areas be exempt to the half load restriction from June 1<sup>st</sup> to March 1<sup>st</sup> annually upon approval being granted by the City of Kenora Roads Supervisor, or Designate"; and further

THAT Council gives three readings to a new comprehensive by-law regarding dates for a Reduced Load Period.

## 6. Ban on Feeding Wild Animals – By-Law 74-2008 RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council hereby repeals By-Law Number 74-2008, being a By-Law to prohibit the feeding of wild animals within the boundaries of the City of Kenora in order to incorporate the following changes recommended by the City Solicitor:

1.a) Definitions "Wild Animals" to read:

"all mammals other than domestic animals (some examples include, but are not exclusive to deer, bears, fox, squirrels, groundhogs, etc.)"

1.b) Definitions "Feed" or "Feeding" to read:

"means the deliberate act of furnishing, or otherwise making available, food or other substances which is likely to be consumed by wild animals"

1. Definitions – Add (e):

" Device" refers to feeding stands, salt blocks, bird feeders less than 8' eight feet) in height"

2.c) Prohibitions of Feeding - replace "materials" with "device".

Schedule "A" - A decrease in fee structure; and further

THAT following adoption of the by-law, Administration make arrangements to establish a Set Fine Schedule for this purpose as set out below:

Section 2. (d)	Failure to modify or remove device	\$ 200.00
