Please find below a list of Community Activities that the Recreation Programmer played a role in during the year 2009.

High School Sports

Facilitated Men and Women's varsity team within both of our local high schools to teamed up with the City of Kenora's Fitness Consultant for improved training and conditioning and use of the Kenora Recreation Centre

Partnered with local Family Health Team to offer a 12 week nutrition and fitness program for members of the family health team.

PA Days 2009

A day full of events was created so school age children can spend P.A. Days at the Kenora Recreation Centre. Over 200 kids on any given PA Day have enjoyed a safe, fun environment to spend their day off school.

Revenue Impact \$2,400.00

Winter Carnival

The Recreation Services Department worked alongside the Tourism Department to offer programming for the 2009 Winter Carnival. Activities that were programmed over 3 days were: Open hockey for Women, Men and Kids; Public Skating; Public Swims; Teen Swims; Surprise Carnival Swim including boat races, treasure hunts. Zumba fitness conducted outside of city hall in parking lot.

Rec Connection Conference

Attended the 2009 Recreation Connections Manitoba (RCM) Annual Provincial Conference which offered a variety of professional development, recreation, sport and leisure related workshops.

Family Day

February 16th 2009 council resolved for the Kenora Recreation Centre and Keewatin Memorial Arena to be open. Activities ran all day long including public skates, to "OLI the inflatable" in the pool, group fitness classes and the fitness centre open. This day gave families an opportunity to recreate and spend time together.

School Groups

The Kenora Recreation Centre has partnered with high school teachers to offer their phys-ed classes at the Kenora Recreation Centre. They have done it all, from designed workouts, to open hockey, to swimming lengths of the pool and taking part in instructional classes.

First ever March Break Day camp offered to the parents of our city to give them a safe, fun place to bring their kids over the break.

61 kids throughout the week -- \$2,035.00

Walk 'n' Talk

Partnered with KACL's Fitness Friends and Coulis Connection to offer a Walk 'n' Talk program for people to come out and exercise for FREE over lunch. This program was to promote inclusion within our community and providing a source of healthy living. 40 different people participate in both spring and fall sessions we offered.

Hockey Day in Canada

The programmer played a key role on the host committee to bring Hockey in Canada to the City of Kenora. This was a great learning experience.

All hockey/figure skating schools and general ice users booked for the five weeks of summer ice.

After-School Grant

Kenora was a successful candidate and receiving \$54,698.00 in monies for the after-school programs from the Ministry of Health Promotion. The city will now provide four local programs with extra staff; partnerships with in the community to provide healthy living, physical fitness and healthy eating options and nutrition education to the students in those programs.

(\$4,890.00 in 2009 applied to Recreation Programmers wages for facilitation of this grant)

Redneck Regional's

I participated on the committee that reviewed and recommended options for the creation of a new special event for the city of Kenora. Though this event was not approved in the end, a lot of hours were spent planning and organizing.

Awesome Adventures

This 5 day program allowed the children of our community to spend a week with us participating in all different types of activities.

34 kids attended for \$1,785.00

4 on 4 Summer Hockey

This program was designed to offer open hockey to the kids throughout our city. For one week in the summer they are able to come out and play hockey for fun, no one watching, testing, coaching it is simply to throw the puck down and have fun.

Triple Play

Sit on the Triple Play committee as a resource. It has been a wonderful experience to ensure that as a city we are alleviating barriers to recreation, and how we can help.

Triathlon

The Kenora Recreation Centre teamed up with a local athlete to offer a 2 day training program with a race day for kids who were interested in Triathlons. It was a successful event and the improvement of the young athletes was incredible.

The Kenora Recreation Centre responded to a request from Warren Brinkman and Shannon Brown (NWHU) to provide space for the high demand of the H1N1 vaccine. Appropriate, accessible space was found within our facility, and our community was able to offer the vaccine to our residents.

The Torch Relay event did not take place in 2009 but a lot of meetings, organization and hours were put in over the year to prepare for this once in a life time event happening in the 2010. For the first time in 5 years the City of Kenora had a float in the Christmas parade. The float promoted the Torch Event and that was going on across Canada and we distributed our proud Canadian mittens to the community.

Christmas Break Event

The Kenora Recreation Centre offered a safe, fit and fun day programs for parents to register their kids in during the school break.
