**Re:** Pinecrest Community Club

## **Recommendation:**

That Council of the City of Kenora hereby support discussions with the Kenora District Roman Catholic Separate School Board for the conveyance of the former Pinecrest Community Club property; and further

That Administration be authorized to meet and review the terms of the draft Agreement as presented to Council with the Kenora District Roman Catholic Separate School Board.

## **Background:**

The Property & Planning Committee had previously been updated on preliminary discussions with the Kenora District Catholic School Board (KDCSB) and the issues highlighted with respect to the potential transfer of the Pinecrest Community Club:

- 1. Transfer of Land to KDCSB
  The City is interested in transferring the property to
  KDCSB except for a small portion encroaching on a
  residential driveway. It is Council's intent to maintain
  the Pinecrest Community Club property for recreational
  purposes. This would be registered on title and
  ownership would revert back to the City if the use of
  the property changed.
- 2. Use of the Property
  KDCSB would maintain the skating rink for school
  activities as well as community uses in the off-hours
  such as weekends and evenings. Insurance and
  associated liability would rest with KDCSB. KDCSB
  suggested that the area may be developed further with
  playgrounds and perhaps lacrosse in the summer.
  KDCSB has access to student resources for ice cleaning,
  flooding, and snow shoveling as well as maintenance
  staff resources.
- 3. Pinecrest Community Club Building

Actual building is of little or no value and KDCSB would work in partnership with the City to demolish the building.

4. Services to Buildings

There are water and sewer as well as hydro services to the present building. If the building is torn down KDCSB may be erecting another building at a different location on the property to make more effective use of the property to access adjacent buildings. The City will advise of alternate water and sewer hook-up options for another building.

- 5. Joint Use Agreement
  Draft copy of a potential joint use agreement was
  circulated which would allow public use of the facilities
  by the Pinecrest area residents.
- 6. Condition of Rink Boards
  City was requested to inspect the rink boards and
  advise of their condition and remaining useful life.

## **Draft Agreement**

In response to the KDCSB request, a draft agreement has been developed by the City solicitor outlining basic terms and conditions for consideration for transfer of the property.

The KDCSB will be meeting on Wednesday, June 23<sup>rd</sup> and has requested a meeting with City representatives to discuss terms and conditions of the potential land transfer.
