Call to Order

Mayor Canfield called the meeting to order and Councillor Lunny read the Prayer.

Public Information Notices as per By-law Number 144-2007

Mayor Canfield then read the following notices:-

Deputations

Youth Council – NWHU (Youth Action on Drugs)

The Youth Council is a group of youth from Kenora who work with elected officials to strengthen the youth standpoint in the community and help illustrate the current everyday issues. The group will be maintained with a President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary with a minimum of seven members and at least two representatives from each high school. The age category will be from ages 14-20 and there will be a minimum of one year commitment requirement to hold office. The group is currently funded by the Northwestern Health Unit, however, this is only short term and they are seeking a meeting place funded by Council to continue to hold their by-monthly meetings. Council thanked the youth members present along with Kristin Bulmer from the NWHU for their presentation and a copy was left with the Clerk.

Portraits of Honour Project

George Storm and Carol Davis advised Council that they have secured the Portraits of Honour display for Kenora on December 1st. The display trailer will be located in the new Fire and Emergency Services building and an event is being planned to invite the public to come to see this magnificent display. The display has a picture of every soldier we have lost in Afghanistan. It affords the opportunity to display the mural and brings Canadians together to remember, honour and celebrate our Canadian Forces. Council thanked George and Carol for their efforts and a copy of the information was left with the Clerk.

Houseboats off Coney Island

Rita Henley (in conjunction with Larry Beacham) addressed Council with her concerns regarding their decision this evening. She indicated that she had called Ocean and Fisheries 9 years ago to ask if they could drop a mooring in Lake of the Woods waters and they informed them that they could as long as we stayed off private property and out of the main channel of all boats. She asked Council to consider the hardship that is being caused with this deadline and the availability of choices they have to explore. They are asking for an extension to find other alternatives. Council thanked her for her deputation and a copy was left with the Clerk.

Houseboats off Coney Island

Brian Finck & Wendy Capri addressed Council regarding the transparency regarding this matter and why a solution could not have been found by working together. If more time was provided it would allow the opportunity to explore other options and would relieve some of the undue stress on the families. They are willing to abide by rules that are established, but are just asking for time and have been trying to be part of the solution from day one. They questioned if Council was aware that it will cost approximately \$12,000 of taxpayers' dollars to remove the boats from the bay. They thanked the public for their support in their battle for more time on this matter. Council thanked them for their presentation and a copy of the information was left with the Clerk.

Houseboats off Coney Island

Rhoda Brown is one of the owners of a houseboat in the location in question. She noted that the owners are all hardworking, law-abiding tax paying citizens and all they want to do is enjoy the beauty of the Lake of the Woods with the resources they have. They have invested their time and money as not everyone has the unlimited resources to purchase property on the lake. She indicated that they are respectful owners and belong to the organization of the Lake of the Woods Boaters Association to enjoy the friendships of like-minded interests but also ensure that they are good stewards of the lake. Many of the houseboat owners have been at the location for a decade or more and without incident. If this is an area under Municipal jurisdiction then why not offer the owners a lease agreement? It could be developed that would restrict it to only the boaters that are there at this time as part of a grandfathering clause. She further noted that finding alternative locations are not simple especially during this time of the year. There are waiting lists at marinas and some are restricted from allowing houseboats. The location at Coney Island is ideal as it provides a safe location out of boat traffic and not in direct line with any camps on Coney. It also allows the owners to freeze their boats in because the ice does not get thick enough that it will destroy their pontoons or harm the motors as removing costs thousands of dollars to remove the boats every year. She concluded her deputation by requesting Council to consider entering into a lease agreement allowing the existing boaters access to this area or to extend the deadline to May 15, 2012 to allow the existing boaters time to find alternative mooring. Council thanked her for her deputation and a copy was left with the Clerk.

Houseboats off Coney Island

Ruth Bowiec was present to offer support to leaving the houseboats where they are located near Coney Island. In a City that promotes tourism, the houseboats are a tourist attraction much like the float planes. Ruth has done the colour commentating for the Sunday brunch cruise aboard the MS Kenora for 27 years and have had many guests ask who owns the houseboats. The passengers have always had positive comments about the boats. Ruth added that she doesn't know anyone who owns the houseboats and has no personal interest in the matter, but suggests that Council should be leaving the houseboats in this location and they are not a nuisance to the community. Council thanked Ruth for her presentation and left a copy with the Clerk.

Houseboats off Coney Island

Eugene Lapointe addressed Council with his concerns regarding the eviction of the houseboats. Mr. Lapointe questioned if there have been any official complaints filed with the police or any warnings provided to the owners who are causing the problems. He further explained the cost of removing the houseboats to the City as well as the owners annually if they were to be removed. He was also requesting Council to work with him and the members of the Lake of the Woods Boaters Association towards finding an amicable resolution to this situation. Council thanked Mr. Lapointe for his deputation and a copy was left with the Clerk.

Amendment to Discharge of Firearms By-law

8. Moved by S. Smith, Seconded by R. Lunny & Carried:-

That Council hereby approves an amendment to the Discharge of Firearms By-law #148-2010 to authorize an extension to the areas in which deer hunting is allowed within City limits, for a trial period only for the period October 1, 2011 up to and including November 15, 2011, with the following restrictions:

- Hunting shall be restricted to hunting of deer only south of Highway 17A (the By-pass);
- Firearms authorized to be used for hunting within City limits south of the bypass shall be restricted to archery equipment as defined per the rules and regulations of the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Act;
- Hunters eligible to hunt within City limits south of Highway 17A (the By-pass) shall be restricted to those eligible to hunt under the Resident – Open Season, as defined within the Ontario hunting regulations;
- Hunters shall have all required licenses and courses and comply with the rules and regulations as set out in the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Act and adhere to all related Provincial and Federal statutes;
- Hunting shall only be permitted on parcels of land of an area of five (5) hectares or greater;
- Hunting shall be prohibited on all city owned land;
- Hunting shall only take place on either crown land or private property which lies within the designated hunting areas and related size restrictions;
- Hunters must obtain written permission to hunt on private land from the property owner and display written permission at request of a Law or By-law Enforcement Officer;
- Discharging a bow and arrow within 75 metres of an occupied dwelling or roadway is prohibited;
- No bow and arrow shall be discharged in the direction of any human, roadway, structure or domestic animal within reasonable range of the weapon at an angle which might allow the projectile to strike at, or dangerously near these objects;
- Field dressing shall be done in accordance with the wishes of the property owner and remains shall not be disposed of on City property.
