The Program received one million dollars over five years (2009-2014) for social sciences and humanities research council who funded the research partnership between the University of Manitoba Natural Resources Institute, the University of Winnipeg Environmental studies, Grand Council Treatv #3, Citv of Kenora, Obashkaandagaang First Nation, Ochiichagwe'babigo'ining Ojibway Nation, Wauzhushk Onigum Nation. There are 40 partners in the program and have participated in the forums held. The group is working to keep the community partners involved in the project. The Project purpose is to understand and build capacity for crosscultural collaboration and social learning for sustainability. Four objectives include: (1) What triggers and shapes cross-cultural collaboration and social learning; (2) How does collaborative land use planning contribute to social learning and does that learning support sustainable local and regional economies; (3) Increase awareness of sustainable and social and economic benefits of cross collaboration and the common ground initiatives; (4) Enhance capacity for cross-cultural collaboration, social learning and planning for sustainability.

Many developments and studies have taken place since inception of the Program. Today, the Common Ground partners feast the land each Spring and Fall and continue to provide first rate opportunity for the graduate students to continue to learn.

Council thanked the group for their presentation which concluded at 3:20 p.m.

### **Bicycle Routes Committee** (3:45 p.m.)

The Kenora Bicycle Trails Committee is a subcommittee of the Kenora Urban Trails Committee and members include Councillor Sharon Smith, Northwestern Health Unit, OPP, LOWBIC, LOW Development Commission, Resource staff from City as well as recreation, competitive and commuter cyclists. The mission of the group is to establish a network of safe, signed and marked bicycle routes connecting all built up areas and key attractions of Kenora with each other and with major routes leading to the outlying areas. Where feasible, those routes will accommodate other means of selftransport such as roller blades, skateboards, wheelchairs and be suitable for use by all ages and skill levels of residents and visitors.

Positive outcomes to the group initiatives would obviously be the promotion of exercise and healthy lifestyles as well as the impact to the environmental reduction of energy consumption and emissions. Under economic development the trails would provide an affordable means of transportation and would increase the attractiveness of our community to the visitors and potential new residents. Bicycle trails are very appealing to visitors and residents alike as they provide a method to explore Kenora in a safe

manner. The committee would like to establish lanes on the paved
shoulders from the west boundary of Keewatin to the round-about and fron
the east boundary of Kenora to the east tourist information centre. This
would require route signage as well as painting on the paved shoulders. The
group would then continue to identify a route through all of Kenora and
seek sources of funding. The need for bicycle routes in Kenora is identified
in the Official Plan, the Beaches, Parks & Trails study as well as the
Economic Development plan. Kenora is a bicycle ready community with
many wide shoulders on major routes, relatively low traffic flows and
increasing bicycle traffic. The group is requesting that the City include the
Bicycle Trails Committee in consulting process for future road work. Council
