# **Corporate Services**

Councillor McMillan, Chair, reviewed the Committee reports:-

1. K.D.S.B. Report from Councillor Roussin Monthly Update

Councillor Roussin referred to some concerns with the Dryden KDSB Office and related health issues. He noted the Ministry of Labour, Northwestern

Ontario Health Unit as well as the owner of the building have been contacted and various testing is being done on the building at this time. Councillor Roussin also indicated there is a zero-based budgeting session scheduled for September 15 (looking at implementation in 2013), and the next full training for Senior Management and Board Members is October 17 and 18. Reference was made to recent documentation from Iain Angus on recommendations to improve Social Assistance in Ontario and there have been submissions made that a complete audit may be required by the Boards however the Commission had not looked beyond Thunder Bay during the process this year.

Councillor McMillan asked about the Land Ambulance matter and Councillor Roussin advised that September 29 is the next Board meeting and it is expected there will be an update at that time.

# 13. Deer Management Recommendation:

That Council hereby approves an amendment to the Discharge of Firearms By-law #148-2010 to authorize an extension to the areas in which deer hunting is allowed within City limits, for a trial period only for the period October 1, 2011 up to and including November 15, 2011, with the following restrictions:

- Hunting shall be restricted to hunting of deer only south of Highway 17A (the By-pass);
- Firearms authorized to be used for hunting within City limits south of the by-pass shall be restricted to archery equipment as defined per the rules and regulations of the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Act;

- Hunters eligible to hunt within City limits south of Highway 17A (the By-pass) shall be restricted to those eligible to hunt under the Resident – Open Season, as defined within the Ontario hunting regulations;
- Hunters shall have all required licenses and courses and comply with the rules and regulations as set out in the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Act and adhere to all related Provincial and Federal statutes;
- Hunting shall only be permitted on parcels of land of an area of five
   (5) hectares or greater;
- Hunting shall be prohibited on all city owned land;
- Hunting shall only take place on either crown land or private property which lies within the designated hunting areas and related size restrictions;
- Hunters must obtain written permission to hunt on private land from the property owner and display written permission at request of a law or by-law enforcement officer;
- Discharging a bow and arrow within 75 metres of an occupied dwelling or roadway is prohibited;
- No bow and arrow shall be discharged in the direction of any human, roadway, structure or domestic animal within reasonable range of the weapon at an angle which might allow the projectile to strike at, or dangerously near these objects;
- Field dressing shall be done in accordance with the wishes of the property owner and remains shall not be disposed of on City property; and further

That Council hereby authorizes an amendment to the Prohibit Feeding of Wild Animals By-law #139-2008 to authorize the feeding of deer within City limits north of the by-pass.

A discussion ensued on the feeding of deer and Councillor Smith was adamant there be no feeding of deer within city limits and that the recommended amendment not proceed.

It was agreed at this time to remove the proposed amendment to By-law #139-2008 until the Open House takes place this coming Thursday at which time there may be feedback to this concept. For now only the Discharge of Firearms By-law will go forward Monday for an amendment.
