Multi-Disciplinary Task Force

Whereas the City of Kenora is approving today Kenora's Homelessness & Behavioural Issues Task Force Work Plan; and

Whereas the Kenora District Services Board is required to develop a ten year housing and homelessness plan in 2013 under the current Provincial Mandate; and

Whereas the work plan as approved today by Kenora City Council is being submitted to the Kenora District Services Board for inclusion in the development of their ten year housing and homelessness plan for submission to the Province; and

Whereas Kenora City Council believes the best opportunity for a successful implementation of the strategies as contained within both the Kenora Homelessness & Behavioural Issues Task Force Work Plan, as well as the ten year housing and homelessness plan currently being developed by the Kenora District Services Board, will be facilitated through working together as a region by accessing expertise from a cross section of various disciplines to work on this implementation;

Now therefore be it resolved that the Council of the City of Kenora hereby requests the Kenora District Services Board to establish a Regional Multi-Disciplinary Task Force with the necessary budget and staff resources to address Homelessness and support services on a regional basis; and

That those staff resources be placed within those municipalities that have a higher rate of homelessness and associated support service needs within the Kenora District Services Board area, with the mandate of those staff being the coordination and delivery of services to the Homeless; and

That the purpose of this Regional Multi-Disciplinary Task Force be:

- to ensure follow through of the Homelessness mandate through community consultation throughout the region;
- to ensure Homelessness and necessary support services are addressed; and
- to petition the Provincial and Federal Government for funding to address and implement the identified needs; and further

That a copy of this resolution be sent to the Kenora District Services Board for their consideration, as well as to the municipalities within the Kenora District Services Board area.

Homelessness & Behavioural Issues Task Force Work Plan

Whereas for decades now, Kenora has faced issues related to homelessness and disorderly behaviours; and

Whereas Kenora City Council approved the establishment of a Task Force on Homelessness and Behavioural Issues in 2012 with the intent of developing a work plan for strategies that should be implemented with the intent to move towards a solution to the homeless and behavioural issues in Kenora; and

Whereas the Homelessness and Behavioural Issues Task Force has developed a Work Plan, dated September 2013, identifying key partners and recommended strategies intended to end these issues, recognizing it is no longer acceptable to simply manage them;

Now Therefore be it resolved that Kenora City Council hereby approves and endorses the September 2013 Work Plan as developed by the Homelessness & Behavioural Issues Task Force; and

That a copy of this plan, together with a request for endorsement of the plan, be sent to Treaty #3, together with a letter of appreciation to Treaty #3 for the participation of their appointed representative to be a key member of the Homelessness and Behavioural Issues Task Force, working in partnership to develop this plan, as well as a request for working together in partnership in engaging senior government in working towards the active implementation of the strategies as contained within the work plan; and

That a copy of this plan be sent to the Kenora District Services Board to assist that organization in the development of their consolidated housing and homelessness related plan as mandated by the Province, together with a request for support of the work plan, including inclusion of the core strategies into their plan; and

That Kenora Mayor and City Council commit to active leadership in moving forward in implementing the strategies within the work plan, including engaging the Federal and Provincial Governments in working towards active partnerships to ensure successful implementation of the strategies as contained within the work plan and further

That Council hereby formally thanks the Homelessness and Behavioural Issues Task Force Members for their involvement and hard work in the development of this work plan.

Snowmobile Permit Reciprocity

27. Moved by S. Smith, Seconded by R. Lunny & Carried:-

Whereas the City of Kenora is geographically located in close proximity to the Province of Manitoba, and the State of Minnesota; and

Whereas many visitors to the City of Kenora and surrounding area are from the Province of Manitoba and the State of Minnesota; and

Whereas citizens of Kenora and surrounding area enjoy travelling to Manitoba and Minnesota by means of snowmobiles during the winter months; and

Whereas winter tourism is important to Ontario, Manitoba and Minnesota and their residents alike; and

Whereas snowmobilers previously enjoyed the freedom to travel within Ontario, Manitoba and Minnesota with their home trail permit through reciprocity; and

Whereas this reciprocity benefited all three jurisdictions where there are many small communities that rely on much needed winter tourism; and

Whereas when this reciprocity ended the number of winter tourists declined as people were unwilling to purchase multiple permits in multiple jurisdictions to travel throughout the provinces and states;

Now therefore be it resolved that the Council of the City of Kenora hereby supports Snowmobile Permit Reciprocity between the Sunset Trail Riders (OFSC District 17), the Province of Manitoba and the State of Minnesota; and further

That the City of Kenora encourages other districts to support the same reciprocity to encourage and promote winter tourism in all our areas to benefit the communities as a whole and encourage winter tourism in Ontario, Manitoba and Minnesota.

Regulating Parking on Private Parking (KHCC)

Whereas Sections 100 and 100.1 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O.2001, c.25, as amended, authorize municipalities to regulate or prohibit parking or leaving of motor vehicles without the owner's consent on land not owned or occupied by the municipality; and

Whereas the Kenora Health Care Centre has requested assistance from Kenora City Council for monitoring and enforcing the signed no parking provisions in the access area in front of the clinic doors; and

Whereas Council has requested administration to provide assistance with the requested enforcement due to the nature of the facility and the services provided therein;

Now therefore be it resolved that Council hereby approves enforcement for the no parking area in front of the Kenora Health Care Centre clinic doors under the existing "parking contrary to sign" enforcement provisions in accordance with the authorities as granted within Sections 100 and 100.1 of the Municipal Act; and further

That three readings be given to a by-law for this purpose.

Zoning By-law Amendment - Lougheed

That Council approves Zoning By-law Amendment Z04/13- Lougheed for site specific rezoning from RU – Rural, OS – Open Space and HL – Hazard Lands to RR – Rural Residential, OS – Open Space and HL – Hazard Lands [29] Notwithstanding any other provisions of this By-law, on the lands noted by [29] on the Schedules to this By-law, and specifically described as Part of Lot 21 Plan M-135 and part of Location LK2, Geographic Township of Pellatt, City of Kenora, District of Kenora be rezoned to RR – Rural Residential in areas not subject to flooding per the City of Kenora Official Plan, 2010, HL – Hazard Land to permit accessory structures in which human habitation will not be permitted and access driveways, and OS – Open Space to permit only docks, as the application is consistent with the Provincial Policy Statement (2005) and meets the purpose and intent of both the City of Kenora Official Plan (2010) and Zoning By-law Number 160-2010, as amended for the reasons outlined in the planning report; and further

That the appropriate bylaw be adopted for this purpose.

Extension of Municipal Services – Cameron Bay
