6. Other

There was discussion of the previous noted concerns regarding the Needle Exchange Program and how the Committee remains concerned about citizens and children finding improperly disposed needles around the City. The Committee agrees with the concept of the program and are not against it but would still like to see more focus on fixing the concerns. It was suggested to have the NWHU contacted more often to retrieve the needles when they are found rather than just picking them up. It was suggested that blue lights could also be a solution for public washrooms to deter users.

Kendall announced that November 25th is the International Day for Eradication of Violence Against Women, to show support and solidarity to women suffering different kinds of violence in their lives. The CN Tower will be lit in purple and the Parliament Building will be wrapped in purple in recognition of the day. Purple scarves are available in Kenora at the Women's Shelter for a five dollar donation and people are asked to wear their scarves in the community for the two weeks following November 25 to show their support.

Councillor Gallivan announced the Kenora Christmas Tree Lighting to take place this Thursday, December 21 at 5:30 p.m. The tree will be lit followed by an Open House at the Museum.
