### 4.1 Staff Presentations

Kenora Professional Firefighters Captain Terry McLeod, Firefighter Kenton Ammerman and Firefighter Earl Bichon were presented with a Certificate of Appreciation by Mayor and Council for their heroic measures in saving a women trapped in a burning home in October 2013.

#### 5. Deputations

### 5.1 Tim Gosnell - Central Community Club

Tim Gosnell advised Council that the volunteers of the Central Community Club are pursuing building new club house at the Central Community Club area. The building is beyond repair and all contractors that the group has had evaluate the existing building have noted that the only option is to replace this building. The club sees on average 50 kids per day using the facility in the community and this is a very active club with the demand in the community for it to continue.

Central Community Club is seeking \$9,500 from the City of Kenora to assist with the costs of the building designs for the new building for the architecture drawings. The club has already received positive community support for the actual building of the club house as Remer Roofing has given commitment for roofing along with Solid Construction has given commitment for the building. Jeff VanWalleghem was present to discuss the Kinsmen Club commitment to this project and they believe in this project. The Kinsmen has committed to \$40,000 to this project over the next 4 years. Council commended the volunteers for what they are doing in community and look forward to hearing further specifics on the clubs request to Council.

# **6.17 OPP Billing in Unorganized Territory Recommendation:**

Whereas the City of Kenora is in receipt of the new OPP Billing Model which will see invoices split between base costs and calls for service on an approximate 60/40 split;

And whereas all municipalities will pay the same base cost per property, which is estimated at \$203 per property;

And whereas the new model received Cabinet approval on August 13, 2014 and will commence on January 1, 2015, to be phased in over five years;

And whereas the Municipality of Killarney passed a resolution requesting that the Province implement a billing method for those properties located in unorganized territory;

Now therefore be it resolved that the Council of the City of Kenora does hereby endorse the resolution passed by the Municipality of Killarney and request that the Province implement a billing method for those properties in unorganized territory so those properties contribute their fair share of policing costs; and further

That this resolution be forwarded to the Premier, Minister of Community Safety and Correctional Services, Ministry of Finance, AMO and Sarah Campbell, MPP Kenora-Rainy River.
