E-mailed Updates from Managers

Members extended appreciation to Managers who forward regular updates by e-mail to Council with respect to ongoing/pending items that do not appear on the agenda until action is required. They find this very helpful.

GIS Tracking for Vehicles

Councillor Compton questioned Mr. Perchuk regarding any proposed plans for proceeding with the GIS tracking mechanism in vehicles.

Car Dump West of McDiarmid Lumber

Councillor Compton indicated he had received inquiries from both out of town and local residents pertaining to the car/garbage dump west of McDiarmid Lumber. He noted there are some very old vehicles that are rusting out and have been there for a number of years which pose an eyesore and that it is likely not environmentally friendly. It was questioned if there was any chance the area could be salvaged? It was mentioned the City would have to be prudent as there could be many issues if in fact it is an old landfill site. Mr. Perchuk explained his department would look into it.

<u>Update on Watermain Break – Kenora/Norman</u>

Mr. Perchuk gave an update to Committee on the recent feeder break between Kenora and Norman last Saturday about 8:00 p.m. He explained all pressure was lost but that crews acted quickly. Apparently the main had blown apart south of Birchwood Terrace and a diving team arrived to work on it on Monday. Mr. Perchuk explained the Keewatin standpipe was able to back feed all the way to the Norman area (Husky location) to provide residents with water. The dive team determined it was leaking between Norman and the Hospital and they were quick to find the leak and began repairs at 10 a.m. on Monday. By 2:00 a.m. the work could not be completed so they got another dive team and repairs have been made on a temporary basis. The 16" line was connected again and the line bled, however in the meantime a "boil water advisory" has been issued in the Keewatin and Norman area that will be in effect until two (2) consecutive negative samples are returned.

Mr. Perchuk indicated that crews worked very hard as well as through the night and were also delivering water to residents and they are to be commended on keeping water moving.

Extended Green Light @ Subway

Mr. Perchuk confirmed the extended green for vehicular traffic travelling east will continue when the green left arrow appears at the subway location provided a pedestrian has not pushed the button to walk across the intersection. If this is the case, it will appear as though the traffic lights are not working the way they are intended, but otherwise traffic should be able to proceed onto Main Street.
